Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 29, 1962

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Mrs. Scott, Swanson and Chairman Matthews.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Letters from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and George A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting authorization for George B. Hickey, Chief Deputy Auditor, and Olaf J. Kaasa, Chief Deputy Treasurer, to attend I.B.M. Seminar in Poughkeepsie, New York, were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
