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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 3, 1962

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Monthly report from Donald C. Bennyhoff, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

A letter was read from John K. Harvey, Assistant County
Attorney, stating that the application of Everrett McKown for
detachment from School District No. 568 (Corcoran) and annexation
to School District No. 284 (Wayzata) gives an improper description
of the real property involved. Referred to the Superintendent of
Schools.

A letter from Edward P. Dietrich, Assistant County Attorney, recommending that the County's right to construct and maintain snow fences on certain property be released was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Applications for licenses to sell non-intoxicating malt liquor were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Preventable Diseases, Minneapolis Health Department, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Medical Director, County Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, submitting a list of donors to the Special Program Fund and requesting auto allowance for certain employees in his department were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay the awards were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Contracts and contract bonds were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for furnishing real estate and personal property tax statements to the County Treasurer during 1962 were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

WHEREAS, The 1960 census clearly showed that the Board of Hennepin County Commissioners should be re-districted; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Commissioners believes that commissioner districts should be on a population basis; and

WHEREAS, The County Board of Commissioners unsuccessfully sought legislation to permit re-districting during the 1961 session of the Minnesota State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, The Minnesota State Legislature of 1961 was unable to reach agreement on any re-districting law; and

WHEREAS, The County Board is now in receipt of an opinion from the County Attorney dated June 22, 1962, that the Laws of Minnesota 1929, Chapter 381 is invalid; and

WHEREAS, Litigation in Federal Courts concerning re-districting is now pending: and

WHEREAS, The County Board, in view of the recent County Attorney's opinion, may proceed to re-district; and

WHEREAS, Three weeks' notice of hearing, followed by hearings, must be had before the County Board can adopt a re-districting plan; and

WHEREAS, This Board believes that candidates for public office, as well as the voters of any new district should have ample preparatory time before an election is held; and

WHEREAS, The County Attorney, in his opinion of June 22, 1962, suggests the possiblity that voters could seek a restraining order, presumably after reviewing the merits of a County Board re-districting plan; and

WHEREAS, Filings for office for the general election to be held November 6, 1962, close on July 17, 1962; and

WHEREAS, The Minnesota State Legislature in its session of 1962 may wish to officially repeal Laws of Minnesota 1929, Chapter 381;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Hennepin County Commissioners declare its intention, regardless of what else may happen, to re-district the Board of Hennepin County Commissioners in time for the next general elections in 1964.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 17, 1962

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A monthly jail report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered placed on file.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, submitting the petition of Everrett McKown for set-off of his land from School District No. 568 (Corcoran) to School District No. 284 (Wayzata) was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

The proceedings of the Hennepin County Tuberculosis Control Advisory Board for 1962 were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Judge John A. Weeks, District Court, requesting the Board to assume control of the maintenance of the Juvenile Center and the Home School for Boys was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Gordon Christian, Executive Director, Minneapolis Association for Retarded Children, stating that said organization quote, "waives any action which may be brought against Hennepin

County or the Board of County Commissioners for injury to any campers during the use of the camp grounds and facilities on the Glen Lake Sanatorium campsite", was ordered placed on file.

A letter from Carl C. Christensen, Assessor, City of Bloomington, requesting that the proceedure now used by the County Auditor for notifying applicants for abatement of assessments of the denial of their applications by the Assessor be stopped was referred to the Supervisor of Assessments.

A letter from Alf Bergerud, Senator, 36th District, relative to the redistricting of the County Commissioner's districts, was referred to the Commissioner on Redistricting.

Letters were received from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, as follows:

- 1. Requesting auto allowance for various personnel.
- 2. Requesting the Board to accept funds donated for the Special Program Fund.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Medical Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Edward P. Dietrich, Assistant County Attorney, submitting deeds for right-of-way property were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, as follows:

1. Submitting an agency contract with the State of Minnesota for the improvement of County State Aid Highway No. 92.

2. Requesting adoption of independent truck operator's rates to correspond with industry's pattern for hauling the County's asphalt material.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the forfeiture of a payment for the purchase and removal of a building on right-of-way property.
- 2. Submitting bills of sale for the purchase and removal of buildings on right-of-way property.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay the awards.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A contract and contract bond was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the improvement of a portion of County State Aid Highway No. 35 (Portland Avenue) and for furnishing tax statements to the Treasurer during 1962.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Commissioners Matthews, Ainsworth, Hanson, Mrs. Scott and Swanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the following statement providing for Civil Defense and for protection and promotion of public safety, health, and welfare in the County of Hennepin during Civil Defense emergencies, be enacted:

## Section 1

## Policy and Purpose

Subdivision 1. Because of the existing and increasing possibility of the occurence of disasters of unprecedented size and destructiveness resulting from enemy attack, sabotage, or other hostile action, or from fire, flood, earthquake or other natural causes, and in order to insure that preparations of this county will be adequate to deal with such disasters, and generally to provide for the common defense and to protect the public peace, health, and safety, and to preserve the lives and property of the people of this county, it is hereby found and declared to be necessary:

(a) To establish a county civil defense organization;
 (b) To provide for the exercise of necessary powers during civil defense emergencies and the time of a natural disaster;

(c) To provide for the formulation of mecessary plans and training to meet the requirements of the county missions;

(d) To provide for the rendering of mutual aid between this county and other political subdivisions of this state and of other states with respect to the carrying out of civil defense functions.

Subdivision 2. It is further declared to be the purpose of this resolution and the policy of the county that all civil defense functions of this county be coordinated to the maximum extent practicable with the comparable functions of the federal government, of this state, and municipalities of the county, and of private agencies of every type, to the end that the most effective preparations and use may be made of the nation's manpower, resources, and facilities for dealing with any disaster that may occur.

## Section 2

#### Definitions

Subdivision 1. "Civil Defense" means the preparation for and the carrying out of all emergency functions, other than functions for which military forces are primarily responsible, to prevent, minimize and repair injury and damage resulting from disasters caused by acts of nature, enemy attack, sabotage or other hostile action, or from fire, flood, earthquake or other natural causes. These functions include, without limitation, fire-fighting services, police services, medical and health services, rescue, engineering, air-raid warning

services, communications, radiological, chemical and other special weapons defense, evacuation of persons from stricken areas, emergency welfare services, emergency transportation, existing or properly assigned functions of plant protection, temporary restoration of public utility services, and other functions related to civilian protection, together with all other activities necessary or incidental to preparation for a carrying out of the foregoing functions.

Subdivision 2. "Civil Defense Emergency" means an emergency declared by the governor under the provisions of Chapter 12, Minnesota Statutes, 1957.

Subdivision 3. "Civil Defense Forces" means any personnel employed by the county and any other volunteer or paid member of the county defense organization engaged in carrying on civil defense functions in accordance with the provisions of this resolution or any rule or order thereunder.

## Section 3

## Establishment of Civil Defense Agency

Subdivision 1. There is hereby created within the county government a civil defense organization which shall be under the supervision and control of the county director of civil defense, hereinafter called the "director". The director shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners for an indefinite term and may be removed by them at any time. He shall serve at a salary determined by the Board of County Commissioners and shall be paid his necessary expenses. The director shall have direct responsibility for the organization, administration and operation of the civil defense organization, subject to the direction and control of the Board of County Commissioners. The civil defense organization shall be organized into such divisions and bureaus, consistent with state and local civil defense plans, as the director deems necessary to provide for the efficient performance of civil defense functions during a civil defense emergency.

## Section 4

## Powers and Duties of the Director

Subdivision 1. The director, with the consent of the board, shall represent the county on any regional or state conference for civil defense. He shall develop proposed mutual aid agreements with other political subdivisions of the state for reciprocal civil defense aid and assistance in a civil defense emergency too great to be dealt with unassisted, and he shall present such agreements to the board for its action. Such arrangements shall be consistent with the State civil defense plan and during a civil defense emergency it shall be the duty of the civil defense organization and civil defense forces to render assistance in accordance with the provisions of such mutual aid arrangements.

Subdivision 2. The director shall make such studies and surveys of the manpower, industries, resources, and facilities of the county as he deems necessary to determine their adequacy for civil defense and to plan for their most efficient use in time of a civil defense emergency. The director of civil defense shall establish within the Civil Defense Department an emergency Resources Management section including an Economics Stabilization Service in accordance with State and Federal plan and direction.

Subdivision 3. The director shall prepare a comprehensive general plan for the civil defense of the county including the unincorporated areas and shall present such plan to the board for its approval. When the board has approved the plan by resolution, it shall be the duty of all county agencies and all civil defense forces of the county to perform the duties and functions assigned by the plan as approved. The plan may be modified in like manner from time to time. The director shall coordinate the civil defense activities of the county to the end that they shall be consistent and fully integrated with the civil defense plan of the federal government and the state and correlated with the civil defense plans of other political subdivisions within the state.

Subdivision 4. In accordance with the state and county civil defense plan, the director shall institute such training programs and public information programs and shall take all other preparatory steps, including the partial or full mobilization of civil defense forces in advance of actual disaster, as may be necessary to the prompt and effective operation of the county civil defense plan in time of a civil defense emergency. He may, from time to time, conduct such practice air-warning alerts or other civil defense exercises in accordance with the State Air Warning Plan.

Subdivision 5. The director shall utilize the personnel, services, equipment, supplies and facilities of existing departments and agencies of the county to the maximum extent practicable. The officers and personnel of all such departments and agencies shall, to the maximum extent practicable, cooperate with and extend such services and facilities to the county civil defense agency and to the governor upon request. The head of each department and agency, in cooperation with and under the direction of the director, shall be responsible for the planning and programming of such civil defense activities as will involve the utilization of the facilities of his department or agency.

Subdivision 6. The director shall in cooperation with existing county departments and agencies affected, organize, recruit, and train such civil defense personnel, that may be required on a volunteer basis to carry out the civil defense plans of the county and the state. To the extent that such emergency personnel are recruited to augment a regular county department or agency for civil defense emergencies, they shall be assigned to such departments or agencies and shall be under the administration and control of said department or agency. The director may dismiss any civil defense volunteer at any time and require him to surrender any equipment and identification furnished by the county.

Subdivision 7. Consistent with the State Civil Defense Law, the director shall coordinate the activity of the Municipal Civil Defense organizations and assist in establishing and conducting training programs as required to assure emergency operational capability in the several services (Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 12, Sec. 12.25).

Subdivision 8. The director shall carry out all orders, rules and regulations issued by the governor with reference to civil defense.

Subdivision 9. The director shall direct and coordinate the general operations of all county civil defense forces during a civil defense emergency in conformity with regulations and instructions of state civil defense authorities.

Subdivision 10. Upon instructions from the County Board of Commissioners the director may be ordered to direct and coordinate the general operations of all county civil defense forces during the time of an impending disaster as well as during the time that disaster relief operations are necessary. The director shall carry out all orders, rules, and regulations issued by the county board to alleviate the disaster situation.

Subdivision 11. The director shall, as soon as possible after the end of each fiscal year, prepare and present to the county board for the information of the board and the public, a comprehensive annual report on the activities of the civil defense agency, in addition to monthly activity reports.

#### Section 5

General Provisions on Civil Defense Workers

Subdivision 1. Civil Defense volunteers shall be called into service only in case of a civil defense emergency or a natural disaster for which the regular county services are inadequate or for necessary training and preparations for such emergencies. All volunteers shall serve without compensation, except as provided for in Minnesota Statutes 1957, Chapter 12.

Subdivision 2. Each civil defense volunteer shall be provided with such suitable insignia or other identification as may be required by the director. Such identification shall be in the form and style approved by the state government. No volunteer shall exercise any authority over the persons or property of others without his identification. No person except an authorized volunteer shall use the identification of a volunteer or otherwise represent himself to be an authorized volunteer.

Subdivision 3. No civil defense volunteer shall carry any firearms while on duty except on written order of the county sheriff.

Subdivision 4. Personnel procedures of the county applicable to regular employees shall not apply to volunteer civil defense workers but shall apply to paid employees of the civil defense organization.

# Section 6

## Civil Defense a Governmental Function

All functions hereunder and all other activities relating to civil defense are hereby declared to be governmental functions. The provisions of this section shall not effect the right of any person to receive benefits to which he would otherwise be entitled under this resolution or under the workmen's compensation law, or under any pension law, nor the right of any such person to receive any benefits or compensation under any Act of Congress.

## Section 7

Participation in Labor Dispute or Politics

The civil defense agency shall not participate in any form of political activity, nor shall it be employed directly or indirectly for political purposes, nor shall it be employed in a labor dispute.

Section 8

#### Effective Date

This resolution shall take effect upon its passage.
