The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in Room 130 Court House, in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

Hearing was called for on the question of the reapportionment of the County Commissioner Districts of the County of Hennepin.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavits of publishing the official notice of hearing.

John Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, explained the purpose of the meeting and cited the law which authorized the Board to consider reapportionment (M.S. 1961, Chapter 375.02) and resolution adopted by the Board on October 9, 1962, setting a date for hearing said matter.

John Windhorst, Chairman, Legislative Action Committee, Citizens League of Minneapolis and Hennepin County, presented a report of said committee adopted on November 7, 1962, which stated among its major conclusions "that the County be redistricted in such a way as to place a clear preponderance of suburban population in each of two of the five commissioner districts and that no suburban community be divided into more than a single commissioner district."

The report was ordered filed.

Tuesday, November 27, 1962

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by George W. Matthews, Chairman.

A petition signed by M. J. Shidla, 13000 Maywood Lane, Hopkins, and sixteen others requesting that the lake now named Mud Lake (Section 26, Township 117, Range 22) be changed to Lake Minnetoga was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter was read from E. I. Walling, Minneapolis Superintendent of Police, requesting the Board to approve a plan whereby the County would provide one hot meal a day to those prisoners held in the City Jail for more than twenty-four hours.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, that Ed Ryan, Hennepin County Sheriff, be authorized to provide one hot meal a day to those prisoners held in the Minneapolis City Jail for more than twenty-four hours, and that the Minneapolis Police Department reimburse the County for the cost of said service.

Motion unanimously carried.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting transportation allowance for various employees in his department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means. A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Edward P. Dietrich and David E. Mikkelson, Assistant County Attorneys, submitting deeds for right-of-way property were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, as follows:

- 1. Submitting a preliminary engineering agreement with the State of Minnesota for C.S.A.H. No. 62 and T.H. No. 169 construction.
- 2. Requesting the redesignation of a portion of C.S.A.H. No. 52 (Nicollet Avenue).
- 3. Requesting that the Commissioner of Highways be authorized to process 1963 federal aid projects for Hennepin County.
- 4. Recommending the release of claim for water main damage during the improvement of C.S.A.H. No. 10.
- 5. Submitting a mudjacking agreement with the State of Minnesota for work on C.S.A.H. No. 5 (Minnetonka Boulevard).
- 6. Submitting a storm sewer agreement (C.S.A.H. No. 9) with the Village of New Hope.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

1. Recommending the return of bid deposit to Melvin Amundson

(Parcel 133, Contract No. 66).

2. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the low bid of Albinson, Inc., for furnishing a theodolite and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications were presented as follows:

- 1. Tires and tubes, 1963, Central Mobile Equipment Division.
- 2. Tire recapping, 1963, Central Mobile Equipment Division.
- 3. Diazo print papers, 1963, Central Services Division and Highway Department.
  - 4. Fine papers, 1963, Central Services Division.
  - 5. Purchase and removal of one used bookmobile.
- 6. Grading and bituminous surfacing, Lake Improvement Project No. 624.

The above specifications were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the purchase and removal of buildings, Contract No. 67, x-ray film and chemicals and drugs, anti-biotics and chemicals for the Chest Clinic.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

Only one bid was received for furnishing blades (grader, wing, one-way and bucket) to the Central Mobile Equipment Division.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Swanson, that the bid be returned unopened to the bidder and that Stanley R.

Cowle, Purchasing Agent, be directed to re-advertise for bids for said blades, bids to be opened on Tuesday, December 11, 1962, at 10:15 o'clock A.M.

Motion unanimously carried.

Commissioners Matthews, Hanson, Mrs. Scott, and Swanson submit 1447 the following report:

Following the publication of the 1960 census statistics relating to

Hemmapin County, the board of commissioners recognized that the apportionment of county commissioner districts was inequitable and therefore proceeded
to develop and solicit the various remedies to equalize the population in
each commissioner district.

Confronting the board was an anachronistic law labeled Chapter 381,

Laws of Minnesota, 1929, applying exclusively to Hennepin County. This

statute, in the main, provided for five commissioners, four of whom were to

be elected from the City of Minneapolis. Chapter 381 expressly prohibited

the inclusion of any part of Hennepin County outside of Minneapolis in any

Minneapolis commissioner district. Any attempt to equalize the population

of the five county commissioner districts was impossible under the terms of

the statute.

The board therefore urged action by the 1951 legislative session to correct the obvious inequities but the several proposals presented failed to be enacted.

District Court by several Hennepin County residents urging that the Federal Court direct the commissioners to reapportion the county, the County Attorney reviewed the application of Chapter 381, Laws of Minnesota, 1929, to the redistricting problem and advised the county board that said statute in his judgment was unconstitutional. He further suggested that the county board could proceed to reapportion under the general laws of the State of Minnesota governing county commissioner districts. Section 375.02 of the Minnesota Statutes provides in part:

"Each county shall be divided into as many districts numbered consecutively as it has members of the board. In all counties such districts shall be bounded by town, village, ward or pre-

cinct lines, composed of contiguous territory, and contain as nearly as practicable an equal population. Counties may be redistricted by the county board after each state or federal census, except no county shall after June 1, 1957, redistrict so that any city of the second, third or fourth class shall be in more than two commissioner districts in any one county. When it appears that after a state or federal census 30 per cent or more of the population is contained in one district . . ., such county shall be redistricted by its county board."

The receipt of this opinion from the county attorney resulted in the unanimous adoption by the board of commissioners of a resolution dated

July 3, 1962 which reasserted its stand on the redistricting need and "declared its intention, regardless of what else may happen, to redistrict the board of Hennepin County commissioners in time for the next general elections in 1964".

The subsequent action of the Federal District Court in remanding the issue back to the local level for implementation by the county board or the state legislature makes it incumbent upon the county board to take immediate and specific action to correct the gross violation of democratic principles which heretofore has denied Hennepin County voters equal standards in the designation of their county commissioners.

The majority of the Hennepin County board of commissioners subscribes to the following position on redistricting:

- (1) The responsibilities of the board are primarily administrative combined with limited quasi-legislative and quasi-judicial powers. The application of these powers are county wide in scope which makes it imperative that issues be resolved on the basis of what is best for the County as a whole rather than what is best for a specific constituency.
- (2) We censure the desire of those who would perpetuate the issue of central city vs. its suburbs summoning the conflict as one of irreconcilible interest. We cite the enactment of a redistricting plan which stresses the fundamental principle of population rather than one of

- community boundaries as a step in considering the county as a political entity, a totality of its political units.
- (3) The extant proposals which would make the boundaries of the city of Minneapolis sacrosanct in terms of a three to two division or a four to three division appears to ignore population trends and would only serve to demand action of a legislative session following the 1970 census. In view of the population drift, the redistricting plan to be enacted will keep the solution on the local level and will lend itself to the necessary readjustments following the publication of the 1970 census figures.
- We endorse the principle of redistricting enunciated by the Citizens
  League of Minneapolis and Hennepin County which states in part, "In our
  opinion a county commissioner redistricting proposal which establishes
  several districts consisting partly of Minneapolis and partly of suburban
  territory would tend to diminish greatly the somewhat artificial and
  greatly exaggerated alleged barrier or conflict between the interests of
  the City of Minneapolis and suburban residents. Redistricting proposals
  which require that all districts contain either territory completely
  within the City of Minneapolis or territory completely within the suburbs
  would appear to further aggravate these somewhat artificial and exaggerated
  conflicts and would promote provincial attitudes."
- (5) We support the suggestions of the Citizens League that redistricting be accomplished in such a manner as to place a clear preponderance of suburban population in each of two of the five commissioner districts and further that no suburban community be divided into more than a single commissioner district.
- (6) To insure subsequent mandatory reapportionment, we urge the legislature of the State of Minnesota to amend the general statute on the redistrict-

ing of county commissioner districts to incorporate the following language, "A population quota for each commissioner district shall be determined by dividing the total population by the number of commissioners. In no case shall any commissioner district have more than 10% over or under such population quota."

Essentially, the ideal of political equality holds that every citizen should have approximately the same political weight when casting his ballot for the same office -- whether for representative in Congress, for a member of the state legislature, for city councilman, or for a member of the County board. In some cases, of course, bodies such as the United States Senate and state senates are, by their nature and deliberate constitutional intent, representative not only of people, but of geographically defined units of government. These situations generally exist in a bicameral legislature in which the second house is population-based. This is not true of Minnesota Counties or counties generally throughout the country where traditionally and historically the principle of population has underwritten the basis of representation.

In conclusion, we do not subscribe to the theory that a continuing conflict in interests exists between the City of Minneapolis and its suburban neighbors. Rather we believe there is a strong latent identity of interest which will be fostered, strengthened and supported by a plan of equal representation based on a principal of population rather than one based on the geography of municipal boundaries.

Commissioners Hanson, Matthews, Scott, Swanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The Federal Census of 1960 as evidenced by a certified copy thereof received by the Governor of the State of Minnesota from the Director of Federal Census under the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 600.018 shows the population of the County of Hennepin to be 842,854 persons, and

WHEREAS, The population of Hennepin County is divided between the City of Minneapolis and the so-called rural Hennepin County as follows:

City of Minneapolis 487,616 and the remainder of the County of Hennepin, 355,238, which population is contained in the Fifth County Commissioner District of Hennepin County, and

WHEREAS, Under Laws of Minnesota 1929, Chapter 381, the County of Hennepin was divided into five County Commissioner Districts, four of such districts located in the City of Minneapolis, including the Village of St. Anthony, and one County Commissioner District for the remainder of Hennepin County, and provided that:

" \* \* \* and no part of such county outside of such city shall ever be included with any part of such city in any such district, except as expressly provided herein.", and WHEREAS, This Board has unsuccessfully sought legislation to permit re-districting during the 1961 Session of the Minnesota State Legislature but was unable to do so because of the inability of the Legislature to agree upon any plan for redistricting, and

WHEREAS, Thereafter this Board was made Defendants in an action entitled George Hedlund etal v. Richard O. Hanson,
Hennepin County Commissioner, etal in the United States District Court, Fourth Division, for the purpose of requiring proportional re-districting of the County of Hennepin and the County Commissioner Districts and for other purposes, and

proportionally represented on the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, this Board by resolution dated October 9, 1962, pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes Section 375.02 which required this Board to re-apportion when 30% or more of the population of Hennepin County is contained in one district which occurs in the Fifth County Commissioner District of Hennepin County declared its intention to re-apportion and caused notice of hearing on the matter to be held on the 8th day of November, 1962, pursuant to Section 375.02, and

WHEREAS, On November 8, 1962, pursuant to said notice, this Board met at its regular meeting place in Room 130 of the Court House in the City of Minneapolis and heard all persons desiring to be heard on said matter and read into the official record, all communications received from interested persons or municipalities within the County of Hennepin relating to said matter of re-districting, and

WHEREAS, Various proposals and recommendations were made by the persons in attendance at such meeting and through written communications to the Board, suggesting ways of re-apportioning the County Commissioner Districts of Hennepin County, and

WHEREAS, Some of the suggested plans were outside of the jurisdiction and authority of this Board to accomplish in that such plans recommended an increase in the number of Commissioners and an increase in County Commissioner Districts, and

WHEREAS, This Board gave careful consideration and study to all proposals received, both oral and written, at the hearing held November 8, 1962, and

WHEREAS, This Board has determined that it is for the best interests of the County of Hennepin and its inhabitants that immediate action be taken to remedy the inequalities existing in the County of Hennepin with respect to County Commissioner Districts and further that it is the duty of this Board to remedy such situation as required by law of this state and by direction of the Federal District Court by its Order dated October 3, 1962,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That there is hereby created within the County of Hennepin, five County Commissioner Districts and that the boundaries of such Districts are as follows:
