Tuesday, January 8, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson. . . . First District
Commissioner George W. Matthews . . . Second District
Commissioner Elwood B. Swanson . . . Third District
Commissioner Mrs. I. G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth. Fifth District

Mr. Fitzsimmons administered the oath of office to the commissioners and then called for nominations for the election of a Chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1963.

It was moved by Commissioner Matthews, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, and carried that the voting for chairman and vice-chairman of the County Board be by secret ballot.

Mr. Fitzsimmons designated Commissioners Swanson and Ainsworth to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced three votes for Commissioner Hanson, one vote for Commissioner Matthews and one vote for Commissioner Ainsworth.

Commissioner Mrs. Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Matthews, and carried that a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner Hanson as chairman.

Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Hanson elected chairman of the County Board for the year 1963. Chairman Hanson then took the chair, and called for the election of a vice-chairman of the County Board for the ensuing year. He designated Commissioners Swanson and Ainsworth to act as tellers.

After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Swanson and one blank ballot.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs.

Scott, and carried that a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner

Swanson as vice-chairman. Chairman Hanson then declared Commissioner

Swanson elected vice-chairman of the County Board for the year 1963.

Chairman Hanson expressed his appreciation to the Board for electing him chairman and commended Commissioner Matthews for his many years of public service as chairman of the County Board.

Annual and monthly reports from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, and Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, were ordered placed on file.

A letter from Robert Thurston, Spring Park, requesting permission to set up a dock on county property on Spring Park Bay, Lake Minnetonka was referred to the Highway Administrator.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting an application for the repurchase of tax-forfeited land was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

A letter from Dr. F. G. Gunlaugson, Director, Bureau of Preventable Diseases, Minneapolis Health Department, requesting the commitment of a patient to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, requesting a leave-of-absence for Edward J. Tomczyk, Right-of-Way Negotiator III, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from George A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting the approval of a substitution in the collateral pledged on County deposits was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Submitting claims payable from the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund.
- 2. Requesting the establishment of minimum salvage value on obsolete or worn out items of equipment at Glen Lake State Sanatorium.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the rejection of bids on the sale and removal of one used bookmobile, Contract No. 68.
- 4. Recommending the appointment of Maxwell Seeker as Deputy Director of Civil Defense.
- 5. Requesting authorization for Gertrude Barth and LaVerne Greenseth to attend Seminar for Purchasing Secretaries.
- 6. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay the awards.

Mr. Cowle's letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids on the following items:

1. Publishing:

- a. Board proceedings, County Seat and outside County Seat.
- b. Financial statement, County Seat and outside County Seat.
- c. Delinquent tax list.
- 2. Wrecking and removal of buildings, Contract No. 302.

3. Mobile portable radio units, Sheriff-Radio (second advertising).

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

It was moved, seconded and duly carried that the appointment of Hennepin County's representatives to the Metropolitan Mosquito Control District Commission for 1963 be done by secret ballot.

Chairman Hanson called for election to the position currently held by Commissioner Matthews on said commission and appointed Commissioners Swanson and Ainsworth to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced five votes for Commissioner Matthews. Chairman Hanson then declared Commissioner Matthews elected to represent Hennepin County on the Metropolitan Mosquito Control District Commission for 1963.

Chairman Hanson called for election to the position currently held by Commissioner Ainsworth. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Mrs. Scott and one vote for Commissioner Ainsworth. Chairman Hanson then declared Commissioner Mrs. Scott elected to represent Hennepin County on the Metropolitan Mosquito Control District Commission for 1963.

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Commissioner MRS. Seo from the Committee on Ways and Means offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, This Board has determined that the compensation of salaried County employees be based on a merit-longevity system and that the system of grade numbers, salary ranges and classifications for each position in the County Highway Department, Budget and Purchasing Department, Supervisor of Assessments, Noxious Weeds, Lake Improvement, Central Mobile Equipment Division, Water Patrol, Veterans Service Office, Land Department and Property Rental Division, Remonumentation and Hennepin County Chest Clinic be adopted as hereto attached.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the attached schedules setting forth:

- (1) Hourly employees classifications and pay rates;
- (2) Classification and Salary Grade number assignments, including the salary ranges listed therein, together with the Increment and Longevity Schedule procedures hereto attached, be adopted effective as of January 1, 1963.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board commit itself to the continuation of a policy to adjust all salaries and wages to reflect the community pattern for each respective classification.

 Each salary grade number and range shall have six merit and longevity increment steps of three per cent each. Merit-longevity step increases shall be an administrative procedure as outlined in this resolution.

- 2. The increases in rates of pay other than the automatic cost of living increases are not intended to be completely automatic. An employee shall be eligible for these increments only if he meets the following conditions:
 - A. That, as a new employee, he meets the requirements of length of service which are six months of continuous employment for the next successive step, and an additional twelve months of continuous employment in the same classification for each of the succeeding steps of the increment system. Employees promoted to higher classifications shall require twelve months of continuous employment in the higher classification for each successive "step" increase.
 - B. That he has the recommendation for "step" increases from his division and/or department head.

- The salary of an employee who advances from one grade to another by promotion shall be two full increment steps higher than the salary last received by such employee in the lower classification.
- 4. The effective date of a merit increase shall be the first day of the pay period following the anniversary of the initial 6 month increment increase.
- 5. In determining years of service, absence or leave within regular leave provisions as provided in the department's rules and regulations shall not be excluded in determining such years of service. All other layoffs, suspensions, or leaves of absence shall be excluded in computing years of service and shall defer the date of salary advancement for the same length of time as that of the layoff, suspension or leave of absence.
- 6. A 3% long-term longevity increase shall be granted to all employees, monthly or hourly, on the following factors:
 - A. That he has a minimum of eighteen years of full time continuous service with the County of Hennepin.
 - B. That he has a minimum of one year at the top of his grade and classification assignment.
 - C. That he has the recommendation for the long-term longevity increase from his division and/or department head.
