Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 12, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

A statement of balances in County Revenue allowances as of February 28, 1963, from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered filed.

A resolution adopted by the Village Council of the Village of Orono on March 4, 1963, endorsing the principle of sharing, on a prorata basis, the costs of maintaining a County Hospital facility was presented and ordered filed.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a claim payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting transportation allowance for an employee in his department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Recommending the adoption of new policies and procedures relative to financial and administrative controls in order to keep the Board and administrative officials apprised of the status of programs or finances of County activities.
- 2. Submitting contract change orders for work on the Shelter Care Home and recommending that they be approved.
- 3. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay the awards.
- 4. Notifying the Board of additional work units performed by Riegger Roadways, Inc., for the improvement of a portion of CSAH No. 32, Project No. 6109, and requesting that funds be set aside to pay for said work.

A letter from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, recommending acceptance of various deeds for right-of-way porperty was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

An annual report from Howard W. Perkins, Surveyor, was ordered filed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Highway Engineer shall post the weight restrictions when he shall find that any such highway by reason of deterioration, rain, snow, or other climatic conditions will be seriously damaged or destroyed unless the weight restrictions shall be posted and enforced.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Highway Engineer shall have the authority to determine the limit of the weight restrictions with respect to any of the above designated roads when he shall find that any such designated highway will be seriously damaged or destroyed unless the use of vehicles thereon is prohibited or permissible weights thereof reduced.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in the interest of public convenience the weight limitations as posted by the County Highway Engineer shall not restrict the operation of public bus transportation or school bus transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Highway Engineer shall have no authority to waive the weight restrictions with respect to any other vehicles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all other roads on the county and state aid system of Hennepin County not listed above are restricted to 4 tons per axle weight unless posted.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 12, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

A monthly jail report from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, was ordered filed.

That this order and the proposed school district dissolution, annexation of its territory, and division of assets and liabilities shall become effective as proposed on the expiration of 45 days hereof unless, in the meantime, the school board of any school district to which all or part of territory is proposed to be annexed requests an election in the part of the district proposed to be annexed thereto on the question of assumption of a proportionate share of the annexing district's bonded indebtedness.
- 5. If this order differs from the annexation recommendations of the resident freeholders' petition or the certificate of election for dissolution, or if any school district to which territory is proposed to be attached requests an election on assumption of a proportionate share of bonded debt, the County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed, upon the expiration of 45 days hereof or upon receipt of a request for an election on debt assumption to set a date for an election in the district proposed to be dissolved on the question of approval of this order and the assumption of said debt in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 122.017, Subdivisions 11-16. If such an election is required, this order shall not become effective until such time as the electors of the district approve it and the assumption of bonded debt as requested by any annexing district or, if debt assumption is not approved by the electors, until the annexing district consents to said annexation without assumption of debt within ten days after said election.
- 6. Upon notification by the County Auditor of the date set for an election pursuant to paragraph four or five of this order, the school board of the district shall cause an election to be held in said district in the same manner and upon the same notice required in other school district elections EXCEPT that if the request for an election on debt assumption affects only parts of the district proposed to be dissolved said school board shall create separate election precincts in each such part of said district and only those qualified electors residing in such precincts shall be entitled to vote onthe assumption of the bonded debt of the respective annexing districts.
  - 7. The County Auditor shall, by mail and within 10 days hereof, serve a copy of this order upon:
    - The clerk of the district proposed to be dissolved;
    - The clerks of each school district to which it is proposed to annex any territory of the district proposed to be dissolved;

- The County Auditor of any county containing any area of either the district to be dissolved or any district to which territory thereof is proposed to be annexed;
- 4. The Commissioner of Education.

Commissioner Swanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Twin City Metropolitan Planning Commission was created by the Legislature in 1957 to provide advisory metropolitan planning service on a voluntary, coordinative basis to the governments of the Twin City Metropolitan Area, and

WHEREAS, the Twin City Metropolitan Planning Commission has undertaken and pursued the first phases of its work in the areas of research and preparation of a metropolitan plan which are progressing as scheduled, and

WHEREAS, the Twin City Metropolitan Planning Commission has been able to supplement its revenue from taxation with federal matching funds and a Ford Foundation grant to assist with the work programs which have been undertaken to date, and

WHEREAS, this type of additional financial assistance will not, in all likelihood, be available in the future due to changes in the program of the commission from one of research and plan development to intergovernmental coordination and assistance, and

WHEREAS, this coordination is an urgently needed step in continuing pursuit of solutions to metropolitan area problems, and

WHEREAS, the Twin City Metropolitan Planning Commission has introduced proposed legislation to increase its authorized mill rate from one tenth to one fifth of a mill to assure continuation of its programs;
