Tuesday, April 16, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

A report from the State Department of Welfare on the financial affairs of the Hennepin County Welfare Department for 1962 was ordered filed.

A monthly report from George G. Roadfeldt, County Extension Agent, was ordered filed.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting a list of claims against the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, submitting claims against the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund and notifying the Board of the acceptance of a low bid and requesting that funds be set aside to pay the award were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A bill for an act relating to highway traffic regulations, authorizing local authorities to adopt regulations relating to the direction of travel of bicycle riders, etc. was presented.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs.

Scott, that the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County endorse the bill and urge its enactment by the 1963 session of the Legislature of the State of Minnesota.

The vote on the motion was as follows: Ainsworth, yea, Matthews, yea, Mrs. Scott, yea, Swanson, yea, and Chairman Hanson, yea.

Motion carried.

Specifications for one double-faced roller-shelf case for the Registrar of Titles and weed chemicals were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the placing and removing spar buoys and installing signs at Lake Minnetonka.

The bids were referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

NOW THEREFORE, We, the County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, May 1, 1963, as Law Day in our community and urge that the people of Hennepin County join in the nationwide observance of this day, so that by their support, this important event will be made informative and meaningful for all our citizens.
