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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 21, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

Board of Audit Report No. 2 was ordered published and filed.

The plat of Porter Addition in the Town of Champlin was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

A letter from Paul W. Keve, Director, Department of Court Services, requesting transportation allowance for employees in his department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from George A. Totten, Jr., County Treasurer, requesting the approval of the substitution in the collateral pledged to secure County of Hennepin deposits by the Fidelity Bank and Trust Company was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dewey Tomlinson, Secretary, Minneapolis Memorial Day Association, inviting the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County to participate in the Memorial Day parade and service was ordered filed.
