Tuesday, September 17, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Matthews, Mrs. Scott, Swanson, and Chairman Hanson.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

Letters from Kenneth F. McNulty, Assistant Land Commissioner, as follows:

1. Submitting Appraisal List "571-A" re parcel of land located in the City of Crystal and a resolution authorizing the sale of said property.

2. Submitting an application executed by the City of St. Louis Park for conveyance of certain tax-forfeited land for park purposes, and Transfer List "572-T".

Mr. McNulty's letters were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

A letter from Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, requesting authorization for the attendance of Blanda Weitgenant, Assistant Superintendent, at the National Conference of County Superintendents and County Administrators to be held in Detroit, Michigan, October 6 through 9, 1963, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting an application for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, submitting right-of-way documents were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from Lois M. Anderson, Secretary, Hennepin County Commissioners, submitting her resignation as of November 22, 1963, was referred to the Chairman of the Board.

A letter from Gerald H. Geheren, Special Assistant Attorney General, re petition of the State of Minnesota by James C. Marshall, Commissioner of Highways, for the right to make minor alterations or changes in County Ditch No. 13, in Hennepin County was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, notifying the Board of the acceptance of various low bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Specifications for the purchase and removal of buildings along Hennepin County right-of-way, Contract No. 327, were presented and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Applications for abatement of assessments, correction of taxes and homestead classification were referred to the Committee on Taxes.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisements for bids, Stanley R. Cowle, Purchasing Agent, proceeded to open bids for the following:

1. Purchase and removal of buildings on right-of-way property, Contract No. 325.

The bid was referred to Mr. Cowle for tabulation and report.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Janet H. Daniels, Frank P. Daniels, Jr. and Frank P. Daniels, Sr. asking that their lands described in said petition be set-off from School District No. 585 (Greenfield) to Independent School District No. 883 (Rockford-Wright County).

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notice of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices.

A letter was read from Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, recommending the granting of the petition.

There was no appearance before the Board in opposition to the petition.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Building and Institutions.

Hearing was then called for on the petition of a majority of the resident freeholders of School District No. 562 (Dayton Township) asking for the dissolution of said district and annexation to Independent School District No. 728 (Elk River-Sherburne County).

A subsequent petition was presented signed by the same residents who signed the original petition, ten residents favoring attachment to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka) and nine

residents favoring attachment to Independent School District No. 728 (Elk River).

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publishing the notice of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices.

Letters were read from the following petitioners stating their reasons for favoring attachment to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka).

A letter was read from Mr. and Mrs. John J. Dahlheimer favoring attachment to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka).

A letter was read from Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, recommending that School District No. 562 (Dayton Township) be dissolved and attached to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka), effective June 30, 1964.

Lauren Dahlheimer, Chairman of the School Board of School District No. 562 (Dayton Township and a petitioner, spoke in objection to attaching the district to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka) and asked whether the district could be divided, a portion to Elk River and a portion to Anoka. Mrs. Nelson advised him that this was not possible.

Mrs. Lauren Dahlheimer, Petitioner, also spoke in objection to attaching the district to Anoka.

Floyd Butler, Petitioner, stated that there is no kindergarten bus available to residents of School District No. 562 to Elk River.

Gordon Tulberg, Hennepin County School Survey Committee, spoke recommending attaching the district to Anoka.

Kenneth Parker, Superintendent of Schools, Elk River, was present at the hearing.

The matter was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

Commissioner Swanson from the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions presented the following report:

Your committee recommends that the petition of Janet H. Daniels, Frank P. Daniels, Jr., and Frank P. Daniels, Sr., asking that their land described in said petition be set off from Common School District No. 585 (Greenfield) in the County of Hennepin to Independent School District No. 883 (Rockford) in Wright County, be granted; and

ORDER SETTING OFF PETITIONERS FROM ONE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ANOTHER

State of Minnesota }

At a regular meeting of the County Board of Hennepin County, State of Minnesota, held on the 17th day of September, 1963, the petition of Janet H. Daniels, Frank P. Daniels, Jr., and Frank P. Daniels, Sr., asking that their land owned by them and described in said petition be set off from Common School District No. 585 (Greenfield), came on to be heard by said Board; and it having been made to appear to its satisfaction that notice of said hearing had been published, posted and served as required by law and its order, said Board, having heard all persons interested in said matter, both for and against, finds as follows:

That Janet H. Daniels, Frank P. Daniels, Jr., and Frank P. Daniels, Sr., petitioners herein, are freeholders and residents of Hennepin County; and that they own land now in Common School District No. 585 (Greenfield) described as follows:

The North 1/2 of the Southwest 1/4 (N 1/2-SW 1/4) of Section 33, Township 119, Range 24 West of the 5th Principal Meridian,

and that said land adjoins Independent School District No. 883 (Rockford), in Wright County, Minnesota.

That the reasons for setting off said land of said petitioners, as stated in said petitions, are as follows:

We expect to gain educational advantage for our children over a one room school.

INTERLOCUTORY ORDER
DISSOLUTION OF
SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 562, MINNESOTA

WHEREAS a petition signed by a majority of the resident freeholders of Common School District No. 562, Minnesota, has been presented to the Board of Commissioners of this County praying for dissolution of Common School District No. 562, Minnesota, and

WHEREAS this Board at a hearing held September 17, 1963 heard all persons interested in said matter has investigated and determined the facts, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. That it is hereby proposed to dissolve said Common School District No. 562 which comprises the following area:

All in Township 120, Range 22, Section 9; NE 1/4 of Sec. 8, NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Sec. 8, SE 1/4 of Sec. 5 to the Mississippi River, S 1/2 of Sec. 4 to the Mississippi River.

2. That the territory of said district is proposed to be attached and annexed to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka-Anoka County).
3. That the assets and liabilities, real and personal, of said district to be dissolved, including bonded indebtedness, and the proposed distribution thereof are as follows:

<u>Description of Assets or Liability</u>	<u>Proposed Distribution</u>
Cash, County tuition taxes, 1 mill tax, school district taxes, State and Federal aids, and fees which are or shall become due said Common School District No. 562.	to be used to defray all obligations of District No. 562 and the balance to be paid over to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka-Anoka County).
School and school site:	Is hereby conveyed and granted to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka-Anoka County) on payment of \$1 consideration to Common School District No. 562.

4. That this order and the proposed school district dissolution, annexation of its territory, and division of assets and liabilities shall become effective*as proposed on the expiration of 45 days hereof unless, in the meantime, the school board of any school district to which all or part of territory is proposed to be annexed requests an election in the part of the district proposed to be annexed thereto on the question of assumption of a proportionate share of the annexing district's bonded indebtedness.

5. If this order differs from the annexation recommendations of the resident freeholders' petition or the certificate of election for dissolution, or if any school district to which territory is proposed to be attached requests an election on assumption of a proportionate share of bonded debt, the County Auditor is hereby authorized and directed, upon the expiration of 45 days hereof or upon receipt of a request for an election on debt assumption to set a date for an election in the district proposed to be dissolved on the question of approval of this order and the assumption of said debt in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 122.017, Subdivisions 11-16. If such an election is required, this order shall not become effective until such time as the electors of the district approve it and the assumption of bonded debt as requested by any annexing district or, if debt assumption is not approved by the electors, until the annexing district consents to said annexation without assumption of debt within ten days after said election.

6. Upon notification by the County Auditor of the date set for an election pursuant to paragraph four or five of this order, the school board of the district shall cause an election to be held in said district in the same manner and upon the same notice required in other school district elections EXCEPT that if the request for an election on debt assumption effects only parts of the district proposed to be dissolved said school board shall create separate election precincts in each such part of said district and only those qualified electors residing in such precincts shall be entitled to vote on the assumption of the bonded debt of the respective annexing districts.

7. The County Auditor shall, by mail and within 10 days hereof, serve a copy of this order upon:


1. The clerk of the district proposed to be dissolved;
2. The clerks of each school district to which it is proposed to annex any territory of the district proposed to be dissolved;
3. The County Auditor of any county containing any area of either the district to be dissolved or any district to which territory thereof is proposed to be annexed;

4. The Commissioner of Education.


