Tuesday, November 19, 1963

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

At 10:00 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of the State of Minnesota by James C. Marshall, its Commissioner of Highways, for the right to make minor alterations or changes in County Ditch No. 13 (Brooklyn Center) in Hennepin County in connection with the maintenance and construction of T.H. 94=393.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of publication for the notice of hearing and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing and posting said notice.

No one appeared in opposition to said petition.

The petitioner was represented by Ward P. Gronfield and Donald Manley.

by the petitioner in support of its petition for permission to

made a part thereof, hereby authorizes the Chairman of the County

Board and the County Auditor to sign the Order consenting to and granting permission to make the minor alteration or change in Hennepin County Ditch No. 13.

Kenneth Wolf, Mayor, St. Louis Park, stated that those who object to the 1964 budget for Hennepin County General Hospital as proposed by the County Board base their protest on the state law. He felt that their case could best be presented by Clayton L. LeFevere, Attorney, Village of Richfield, and H. H. Burry, Attorney, City of St. Louis Park.

Mr. LeFevere stated that Representatives from the State
Legislature might best be able to clarify the intent of the Legislature in adopting the bill giving Hennepin County jurisdiction of
Minneapolis General Hospital.

W. G. Kirchner, Representative, North 1/2 of the 32nd Legislative District, stated that the intent of those who worked on drafting the bill and the Legislature was that the cost of operating General Hospital should be shared by the suburbs on a use basis except for the Planning Fund (.1 mill) and the Capital Fund (.5 mill).

Mr. LeFevere asked what the basis was for the expense, tax and cost estimates, and wondered how the Board or Hospital Administrator could compile a budget without estimates. He went on to ask, what the item of Automotive Equipment Rental was, to whom it was paid, and why it was not treated as an operating expense. He also wanted to know, what investigation had been made to determine the ratio of unrecovered costs for services rendered, and that a correct ratio should be applied. He said that according to his knowledge, no municipality had been contacted to determine their unrecovered costs. He also wanted to know, what the basis was for spreading the item of Educational Expense on an ad valorem basis rather than billing the individuals involved, and why there was no offset item for revenue in the University of Minnesota Hospital Service, and why the ratio for use for said service was allocated 44% for Minneapolis and 56% for the suburbs. He further questioned as to why there was no offsetting item for revenue for Ambulance Service and no estimate for recovered expense. He stated that such service should be allocated on a recoverable basis.

Warren Hyde, Manager, Village of Edina, stated that the Village of Edina is satisfied with its present emergency service, manned by the Police and Fire Departments, and wants to continue to use it. He said they had received no complaints because their emergency vehicles did not carry interns, and that the first aid men handled the cases well.

William Frenzel, Representative, West 1/2 of the 30th Legislative District, Golden Valley, stated that he served on the committee that drew the General Hospital Bill and is concerned with the intent

of the bill. He said the only items to be spread on an ad valorem basis are the Planning Fund (.1 mill) and the Capital Fund (.5 mill), all others spread in such a manner are illegal. He also stated, trying to save General Hospital required the efforts of many people, and many concessions were made. He went on to say that the Legislature probably gave General Hospital to Hennepin County too fast but if they had waited any longer, "we would have given you a cadaver."

George Neely, 5605 Vincent Avenue South, Minneapolis, spoke of the comparative mill rates in Minneapolis and suburbs.

Commissioner Ainsworth requested that Owen Stubben, Administrator-Designate, Hennepin County General Hospital, explain how the budget figures were compiled.

Mr. Stubben proceeded to explain the budget. He said that there had been no misconstrual of the intent of the law. He said the law charges the county with providing service to Hennepin County and this was based on consultation with members of the County Attorney's staff. He said the item of Educational Service includes such items as heat, light, etc., based on standards for commonly accepted hospital costs. He said that hospital authorities have argued over the years as to which items should or should not be included and you will not find unanimity of opinion. He also

said that General Hospital is one of the largest educational institutions in the county. Regarding ambulance service, he said he would like to wipe this item off the budget but this would not be good judgment. He also said that you will not find unanimity of opinion on this matter. The law says we have to provide ambulance service on January 1, 1964. The only alternative he said was that if the electorate bodies of the municipalities stated that they do not want ambulance service then he would recommend to the Board that it be stopped.

John Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, stated that Mr. Stubben had sought his advice in interpreting the law. Mr. Stubben stated that the legal questions should be resolved.

Mr. LeFevere thanked the Board for the opportunity of being heard, and stated that this hearing was not a charade nor a dress rehearsal for litigation. He said we should proceed in a cooperative manner on this pilot project.

Commissioner Swanson thanked those present for expressing their views and commended Mr. Stubben for his report.

Chairman Hanson thanked those who came to be heard and commended Mr. Stubben for his work.
