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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, January 7, 1964

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson First District
Commissioner George W. Matthews Second District
Commissioner Elwood B. Swanson Third District
Commissioner Mrs. I. G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth Fifth District

Mr. Fitzsimmons called for nominations for the election of a Chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1964.

It was moved by Commissioner Matthews, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, and carried that the voting for chairman of the County Board be by secret ballot.

Mr. Fitzsimmons designated Commissioners Swanson and Mrs. I. G. Scott to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Hanson and one blank ballot.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. I. G. Scott, and carried that a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner Hanson as chairman.

Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Hanson elected Chairman of the County Board for the year 1964. Chairman Hanson then took the chair, and called for the election of a vice-chairman of the County Board for the ensuing year. He designated Commissioners Swanson and Mrs. Scott to act as tellers.

After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced four votes for Commissioner Swanson and one blank ballot.

Chairman Hanson then declared Commissioner Swanson elected Vice-Chairman of the County Board for the year 1964.

A monthly report and an annual report of fees for 1963 were received from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, and ordered filed.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting Appraisal List "576-A" for tax-forfeited land was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings and Institutions.

A letter from Kent B. Youngdahl, Highway Administrator, submitting a resolution requesting the Commissioner of Highways to make speed zoning surveys and recommendations on various roads, was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

AMBULANCE AND EMERGENCY SERVICE EXAMINATION AND REFERRAL CHARGES WILL BE ADDED TO BILL FOR PATIENTS ADMITTED TO HOSPITAL AS SPECIAL SERVICE CHARGES.

THE \$45.00 PATIENT-DAY RATE FOR OB-GYN SHALL COVER BOTH MOTHER AND CHILD DURING PERIOD OF MOTHER'S CONFINEMENT, AFTER WHICH CHILD SHALL BE SUBJECT TO NURSERY RATE OF \$13.50 PER DAY.

2. OUTPATIENT CLINIC VISITS OUTPATIENT SERVICE RATE IS ALL-INCLUSIVE PER VISIT AND INCLUDES ALLOCATIONS FOR LABORATORY, X-RAY, PHARMACY, AND OTHER MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES. PATIENTS UNDER WELFARE PROGRAMS WILL BE BILLED TO THE HENNEPIN COUNTY WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

3. EMERGENCY SERVICES

- A. Examination and Referral Shall apply to those cases where examination is conducted and referral is made to OPD, private medical care, or elsewhere without performing any specific treatment.
- B. Examination and Treatment shall apply to those cases where examination is conducted and treatment is rendered but diagnostic services of the Labora-Tory and radiology are not employed. Such treatment may include splints, shots, suturing, etc.
- C. EXAMINATION, TREATMENT, AND LABORATORY SERVICE SHALL APPLY TO THOSE CASES WHERE TREATMENT IS RENDERED AND ONE OR MORE DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY PROCEDURES ARE PERFORMED.
- D. EXAMINATION, TREATMENT, AND X-RAY SERVICE SHALL APPLY TO THOSE CASES WHERE TREATMENT IS RENDERED AND RADIOLOGY SERVICES ARE PERFORMED FOR DIAGNOSTIC PURPOSES.
- E. EXAMINATION, TREATMENT, LABORATORY, AND X-RAY SERVICE SHALL APPLY WHEN TREATMENT IS PROVIDED AND THE SERVICES OF BOTH THE LABORATORY AND RADIOLOGY DEPARTMENTS ARE EMPLOYED FOR DIAGNOSTIC PURPOSES.
