

A. Overall Program Statement

A complete out patient clinic has been in operation since 1934, first at Fairview Hospital and since 1945 at the 4th Street and Third Avenue intersection. The attached report for December 1963 lists the various clinic activities for that month, for the entire year of 1963 and also for 1962, 1961 and 1960.

In addition the Chest Clinic maintains a Case Register for Hennepin County of active tuberculosis cases, inactive tuberculosis cases, tuberculosis suspects, and for lung tumors.

B. Specific Services to be Provided

1. <u>Consultation Services</u> to Schools, Court, Health, Welfare, other agencies, and professional persons.

2. Collaborative and Cooperative Services with public health and other groups for community case finding programs.

4. Educational and Information Services

5. Diagnostic and Treatment Services

6. Prevention Services

7. Rehabilitation Services

8. Participation in Research and Surveys

The sum of \$12,000 is requested to help finance a proposed study of the current tuberculosis status of the clinic patients whose names are carried on the Inactive Case Register.

An outline of the proposed study and budget estimates are attached.

Proposed Project for Study:

A systematic recall of all inactive cases who are under the medical supervision of the Hennepin County Chest Clinic and currently listed in the Hennepin County Case Register, with the exception of those persons actively involved in the U.S.P.H.S. Chemoprophylaxis Study, (Phase 1).

Purpose of Study:

A. Patient

- 1. To determine the tuberculosis status of all inactive cases
- 2. Type and length of chemotherapeutic regimen
- 3. Relapse rate
- 4. Length of time under observation
- 5. Is further study indicated.

B. Family

- 1. Tuberculosis status of household contacts
- 2. Reactor rate of household contacts
- 3. Was chemoprophylaxis instituted for dependent children

Source of Inactive Cases

Inactive cases as listed in the Hennepin Gounty Case Register, which is housed in the Hennepin County Chest Clinic. Persons listed in the register are previously diagnosed cases of tuberculosis who were, at the time of diagnosis, residing in the city of Minneapolis, or in suburban Hennepin County.

Medical Evaluation of Persons Under Study

The medical evaluation of persons under study would be the responsibility of the medical staff of the Hennepin County C hest Clinic. Additional staff

will be provided for the purpose of investigation and record keeping. If cooperation of certain cases becomes problematical, family physicians should be requested to submit a written statement regarding the health status of persons involved. All cases and contacts will follow normal clinic procedure.

Contacting Inactive Cases

All cases should be initially contacted by mail. Specific clinic appointments should be made with all respondents. If necessary, a second contact should be made by phone. If no contact is made by either of the above methods, a third contact should be made by a home visit. Additional home visits shall be made if necessary depending upon the circumstances of the particular case.
