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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 21, 1964

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

This being Student County Government Day in Hennepin County, an activity sponsored by the American Legion, Chairman Hanson welcomed students, teachers and Legionnaires from Hennepin County schools and Legion posts who were present at the meeting.

Monthly reports were received from Ed Ryan, Sheriff, re County Jail and from George G. Roadfeldt, County Agricultural Agent. Ordered filed.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting an application for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Kenneth F. McNulty, Land Department Appraiser and Property Manager, requesting authorization to attend the National Convention of Municipal Finance Officers to be held in Dallas, Texas on May 10th to 14th, 1964, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund were referred

to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from L. P. Pederson, County Engineer, submitting right-of-way documents was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Budget Director, as follows:

- 1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various bids and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said awards. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 2. Submitting claims payable from the Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund and the General Hospital Capital Levy Fund. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 3. Requesting authorization for Carl A. Nelson and Andrew Whitton to attend the Conference of the National Association of Purchasing Agents to be held in Dallas, Texas, May 3rd through 6th, 1964. Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
- 4. Submitting a check from the American Insurance Company on the workmen's compensation plan.

Commissioner Matthews moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, that the check from the American Insurance Company in the sum of \$32,581.00, which, as reported by Stanley R. Cowle, Director, Budget and Purchasing, represents the first retrospective plan adjustment on the County's workmen's compensation plan for the period of January 1, 1958 to January 1, 1961, be accepted and deposited with the Hennepin County Treasurer.

Cowle, Director, Budget and Purchasing, be appointed as Acting County Highway Administrator during Mr. Youngdahl's absence.

Commissioners Ainsworth, Sectt, Swanson, Matthews and Hanson offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, The rights and individual freedoms and human dignity which Americans accept as their birth right are made possible by a government of laws and a system of independent courts in which every citizen enjoys equal protection, and

WHEREAS, In today's complex society there is a particular need for understanding on the part of our citizens of all ages that respect for law, and acceptance of the principle of the supremacy of law, is vital to the public welfare and necessary for the preservation of the individual liberties that distinguish our way of life from a totalitarian system, and

WHEREAS, The 1st day of May, 1964, has, by presidential proclamation, come to be observed annually as LAW DAY U.S.A., for the purpose of fostering increased respect for law and a deeper understanding of the place of law in our daily lives, as well as focusing public attention on the potential of law as an instrument for resolving disputes between nations,

NOW THEREFORE, We, the County Commissioners of the County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, May 1, 1964, as Law Day in our community and urge that the people of Hennepin County join in the nationwide observance of this day, so that by their support, this important event will be made informative and meaningful for all our citizens.
