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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 26, 1964

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock

A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Matthews, Mrs. Scott, and Swanson.

Member absent: Chairman Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by Elwood B. Swanson, Vice-Chairman.

A letter from John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, revacation of a portion of the right-of-way of County Road No. 66 in Golden Valley (West of County Road No. 102) was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from H. T. Johnson, Clerk, Village of Plymouth, submitting a resolution adopted by the Plymouth Village Council, May 18, 1964, requesting road improvements on County Roads No. 70 and No. 154, where it intersects Trunk Highway No. 55, in the Village of Plymouth was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting a Withdrawal from Sale List "577-Al" was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds, Buildings, and Institutions.

A letter from Walter P. Halstead, Director, Civil Defense, re Civil Defense service and submitting an accident report on the Great Northern Railroad in Minnetonka Village and a bulletin on the Alaska earthquake was ordered filed.

AND MOVES ITS ADOPTION:

WHEREAS, THE SERVICE LEAGUE OF MINNEAPOLIS GENERAL HOSPITAL WAS INCORPORATED AS A VOLUNTARY NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION NOVEMBER 30, 1959 TO PROMOTE AND ADVANCE THE WELFARE OF MINNEAPOLIS GENERAL HOSPITAL BY (A) UNDERTAKING SUCH PUBLIC RELATIONS ACTIVITY AS WILL ENCOURAGE GREATER INTEREST IN, AND UNDERSTANDING OF MINNEAPOLIS GENERAL HOSPITAL, (B) RENDERING EXTRA SERVICES TO THE HOSPITAL AND ITS PATIENTS, AND (C) RAISING FUNDS THROUGH VARIOUS APPROVED MEANS; AND

WHEREAS THE AFOREMENTIONED INCORPORATION RECEIVED THE FULL ENDORSEMENT AND SUPPORT OF THE MINNEAPOLIS BOARD OF PUBLIC WELFARE AT ITS REGULAR MEETING OF DECEMBER 18, 1959, ALONG WITH CONTINUING AND SUBSEQUENT EXPRESSIONS OF THANKS AND GRATITUDE FOR THE HIGH LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT ATTAINED BY THE SERVICE LEAGUE IN MEETING ITS OBJECTIVES; AND

#### INTERIN AGREEMENT OF AFFILIATION

THE RECENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MIRRESOTA

and

THE BOARD OF CONTESSIONERS, HERREPIN COUNTY

In sharing the common goals of education, research, patient care and community service, it is deemed to the mutual advantage and benefit of the respective parties their constituency and their purposes, to facilitate continuity of the longstanding relationship between the University of Himmesota and Hermepin Gounty General Hospital, successor to Mirmespelis General Hospital.

In purpuence of the aforesaid goals and in furtherance of Session Laws of 1963, Chapter 738, the set establishing the Hernopin County General Hospital providing for the hospital and sadical care of the poor and medically indigent, for emergency care of others, and for the purposes of instruction and promotion of scientific research promoting the welfare of patients, this INTERIM AGREEMENT OF AFFILIATION is provided.

It is expressly understood that the purpose of this INTERIM AGREEMENT OF AFFILIATION is to document and formalise the now existing financial arvangements between the University of Minnesota for its Medical School Staff and Graduate Students and Hennepin Gounty Board of Commissioners for its General Hospital Staff, for the period January 1, 1964 through June 30, 1964. This Agreement shall not be construed as establishing precedent for the Agreement of Affiliation or any part thereof now being negotiated and covering the total implications of affiliation between the University and Hennepin County General Hospital.

The financial arrangement with each of the following departments of the University's Medical School will be as follows:

## I. Department of Anesthesiology

## A. Faculty:

- All HOWH Amosthesiology staff will be paid in full by and at HOWH;
- 2. HOUH will receive consultation services from the Department not to exceed \$1,200 per year, with billings to be rendered quarterly, as in the past.

#### B. Medical Fellows:

 The approved residency programs for Amesthesiology are under University listing with reference to General Hospital as an affiliate hospital, but with no specified number to be offered at General Hospital;

- 2. The Department will assign two Medical Fellows to HOGH to be paid the University stipend rate of \$3,150 per year plus tuition and fees of Shih per year (\$111 per quarter) with reinburgment by HOGH to the University on a quarterly billing as actually assigned.
- II. Department of Medicine (including Division of Internal Medicine and Division of Dermstology)

#### A. Faculty:

- 1. Dr. F. W. Hoffbauer, Professor of Medicine and Chief of Service, to be paid \$23,700 per year, with the University share of \$16,200 to be continued and the balance of \$7,500 by HOM reishursement to University on a quarterly billing, and any other additional increments attributable to the application of the Hennephn County Personnel Plan, effective Jamuary 1, 1964, to be handled separately by HOUH;
- 2. Dr. Peter Fichhorn, Assistant Professor of Medicine and Assistant to the Medical Director, to be paid \$12,720 per year, all by HOOM reinbursement to the University on a quarterly billing, and any other additional increments attributable to the application of the Hennepin County Personnel Plan, effective January 1, 1964, to be handled separately by HOOM;
- 3. Dr. Daws Hiller, Instructor and Assistant Chief of Service, to be paid \$12,210 per year, with the University share of \$8,910 and the balance of \$3,300 by HOBH reintursement to University on a quarterly billing, and any other additional increments attributable to the application of the Hermepin County Personnel Plan, effective Jamary 1, 1966, to be handled separately by HOBH;
- h. One additional Medical Instructor position is authorised in the HOGH budget pending appointment, and it is presently assumed that full payment will be by and at HOGH.

#### B. Modical Fellows;

 The approved residency program for Dermatology is under University listing, with General Hospital as affiliate hospital and with two specified as offered at General Hospital;

- 2. The approved residency for Internal Medicine is under General Hospital listing, with ten authorised;
- 3. All Dermatology and Internal Medicine residents at HOM will be paid the HOM stipend by end at HOM;
- h. Tuition fees of Shhh per year (Slll per quarter) in the Grahute School will be paid by HCEI to the University.

### III. Department of Obstetrics and Cynecology

#### A. Faculty:

 The practice of assigning a part-time Clinical Instructor at \$160.34 per month, with reisburgement to the University on quarterly billing will be continued.

### B. Medical Follows:

- The approved residency program in OB-GIN is under University listing with General Hospital listed as an affiliate, and three specified as offered at General Hospital;
- 2. The residents shall be paid the HCMM stipend as follows:

One first year fellow \$4,500 per year One second year fellow \$5,000 per year One third year fellow \$5,500 per year

Residents will be paid by and at the University the amounts specified above and redwarsed by NCSI to the University on a quarterly billing;

3. The tuition and fees of Shih per year (Sill per quarter) in the Graduate School will be reimbursed by HOCH to the University on a quarterly billing.

- 2. The residents assigned to General Hospital will be paid by ami at the University stipend of \$3,150 per year plus tuition of Ship per year and reisbursed by HCSH to the University on a quarterly billing.

## V. Department of Otolaryngology

#### A. Faculty:

1. No faculty financial relationships specified.

#### B. Medical Fellows:

- The approved residency program in Otoloryngology is under University listing, with General Hospital listed as affiliate and with number offered at HOW specified as two (2).
- 2. The residents assigned to HCGH, and numbering two, will be paid the University stipend of \$3,150 per year and tuition and fees of Shih per year (\$111 per quarter), which will be reisbursed by HCGH to the University on a quarterly billing.

## VI. Department of Pathology.

## A. Faculty:

1. All HOSE Pathology staff are paid by and at HOSH.

#### B. Medical Fellows:

- An approved residency program in Pathologic Anatomy is listed under HCOH, with four offered two the first year and two the second year;
- 2. Residents in Pathology at HOUH will be paid HOUH stipend by and at HOUH;
- 3. The tuition fees of Shik per year (Sill per quarter) will be reinbursed by HCGH to the University on a quarterly billing.

### VII. Department of Pediatrics

#### A. Feculty:

1. Dr. Richard B. Raile, Associate Professor and Chief of Service, to be paid \$18,250 with the University share of \$15,000 and balance of \$11,250 by HOM reimbursement to the University on quarterly billing, and any other additional increments attributable to the application of the Hermopia County Personnel Plan, effective Jamary 1, 1964, to be handled separately by HOM;

 One Medical Instructor position authorised on HCCH budget pending appointment will be paid by and at HCCH.

#### B. Medical Fellows:

- The approved residency program in Pediatrics is under University listing, with HOUR listed as affiliate, and four specified as being affored at General Hospital;
- 2. The residents will be paid the University stipend of \$3,150 per year plus tuition fees of \$100 per year (\$111 per quarter) which will be reisburged by HOM to the University on quarterly billing.

## VIII. Department of Psychiatry and Neurology

- 1. One full-time Instructor in Clinical Psychology at \$600 per month to be reimbursed by HCMH to the University on quarterly billing;
- 2. One Instructor in Clinical Psychology at Shih per month (7h% of full-time) to be reimbursed by HCSH to the University on quarterly billing;

#### ADMINISTRATIVE MEMORANDUM NO. 26

TO:

ALL DEPARTMENT HEADS AND CHIEFS OF SERVICES

OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATOR

SUBJECT: CLARIFICATION OF ROLE OF HCGH

1963 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter No. 738 States in part: "Section 1. Subdivision 1. The County Board of Hennepin County shall henceforth be responsible for providing hospital care and medical service for poor persons who are residents of the County or a municipality therein and for residents of the County who require but are unable to pay the full cost of such care and service, and for others in case of injury or emergency."

"Section 1. Subdivision 2. Hospital care and medical service may be provided by hospitalization or outpatient service at public or private hospitals within the county or elsewhere within the state as determined by the Board. . . ."

"Section 1. Subdivision 7. Nothing Herein shall change the system of caring for the poor in Hennepin County. . . other than hospital care and medical service. . . "

THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES ARE TENTATIVELY ESTABLISHED TO ASSIST INTERPRETATION AND APPLICATION OF THE LAW:

- THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS HAS APPROVED ADMINISTRATIVE MEMORANDUM No. 4, ADMISSION POLICY, WHICH STATES "HOSPITAL CARE AND MEDICAL SERVICE WILL GENERALLY BE PROVIDED AT HENNEPIN COUNTY GENERAL HOSPITAL OR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA HOSPITALS";
- 2. Section 1, Subdivision 2 above states the Board may determine the utilization of public or private hospitals within the county or elsewhere within the state. No additional determinations have been made and no appropriations made therefor; it is also clear no such determinations can be made for out-of-state hospital care and medical service;
- 3. The mailing of our Admission Policy to Hospitals in this metropolitan area, along with an initial supply of application blanks, specifically noted "application prior to admission except in emergency" for admission to HCGH or University of Minnesota Hospitals;

- 4. METROPOLITAN HOSPITALS ADMITTING POOR PERSONS ASSUME RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE APPROPRIATE APPLICATION AND APPROVAL FOR TRANSFER TO HCGH IF ELIGIBILITY FOR HOSPITAL CARE AND MEDICAL SERVICE IS ESTABLISHED; RETROACTIVE APPROVALS INVOLVING FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PRIOR TO TRANSFER TO HCGH ARE NOT PERMITTED;
- 5. Hospital care means acute general hospital care or outpatient services at HCGH and does not extend to the inclusion of nursing home care or boarding home care, or home care however defined, which are the responsibilities of welfare or poor relief programs;
- 6. MEDICAL SERVICE IS NOT TO BE CONSTRUED AS INCLUDING ANY NURSING CARE OR BOARDING CARE SERVICES OR SUPPLIES NORMALLY DEFINED AS RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PURVEYORS OF THE SERVICE AND SUBJECT TO NEGOTIATION WITH AND RELATED REIMBURSEMENT FROM RESPONSIBLE WELFARE OR POOR RELIEF PROGRAMS;
- 7. MEDICAL SERVICES AT HCGH, INPATIENT OR OUTPATIENT, ARE AVAILABLE TO THE POOR ON APPLICATION OR BY APPROPRIATE REFERRAL;
- 8. PUBLIC EMERGENCY AMBULANCE SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE ON CALL TO ALL CITIZENS;
- 9. ROUTINE AMBULANCE SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE TO NON-AMBULANT PATIENTS FOR HCGH OUT-PATIENT VISITS IF THE HCGH MEDICAL STAFF HAS SPECIFIED FOLLOW-UP IN CLINIC OR HOSPITAL ADMISSION:
- 10. Any other transportation requirements for the ambulant HCGH patient are to be resolved by the patient or responsible welfare or poor relief program if they wish to utilize HCGH inpatient or outpatient services;
  - HCGH Medical Staff prescription of drugs for eligibles will be supplied to inpatients on discharge and to outpatients attending clinics; refilling of prescriptions originally issued by HCGH Medical Staff will require outpatient clinic
    revisit, or telephone requests for refill may be directed to the Hospital Pharmacy (330-3998) where the necessary information will be taken, and the medical
    record will be made available for HCGH Medical Staff review before authorization
    of any refill and mailing for HCGH eligible patients;
- 2. HCGH INPATIENT AND OUTPATIENT CLINIC SERVICES WILL BE ORGANIZED ON THE BASIS OF OBLIGATION TO SERVE THE HOSPITAL CARE AND MEDICAL SERVICE NEEDS OF THE ELIGIBLE PATIENT POPULATION. HCGH WILL NOT PROVIDE "SPECIAL" WELFARE OR POOR RELIEF OR PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM DEMANDS, E.G., RELIEF DENTISTRY AS IT IS CURRENTLY KNOWN, CAPACITY-TO-WORK PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS FOR RELIEF CLIENTS UNLESS A COMPLETE VOCATIONAL COUNSELLING PROFILE IS MADE AVAILABLE TO INDICATE THE CLIENT'S OCCUPATIONAL SKILLS TO FACILITATE SPECIFIC PHYSICAL ABILITY DETERMINATIONS; OR COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL MEASURES;
- 3. HCGH SERVICES OR SUPPLIES ESSENTIAL TO HENNEPIN COUNTY SISTER AGENCIES ARE TO BE CONSIDERED AS A SERVICE FUNCTION SUBJECT TO BUDGETARY DETERMINATIONS DURING THE NEXT FEW MONTHS AFTER CONFERENCE WITH ALL PARTIES CONCERNED;
- 4. Any further presumptions of extension or attribution of HCGH service obligations within the scope of "hospital care and medical service" must bear the stamp of prior approval after appropriate definition of projected program content and financial burden.
