The Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

A Notice of Public Hearing on classification of the Minnesota River and tributaries from the State Water Pollution Control Commission was ordered filed.

A report on revenues, expenditures and debt of the cities and villages for 1962 and part of 1963 from the State Public Examiner was ordered filed.

A letter from Charles L. Morse, 401 Lombardy Lane South,
Minnetonka, Minnesota, requesting reimbursement for towing charges
the
incurred at/intersection of Arthur Street and Plymouth Avenue South,
Minnetonka, was referred to the County Attorney and Sheriff.

A letter from Louis Gerbich, Jr. re the Sheriff's request for eighty-seven (87) new personnel to provide bailiffs and serving of papers for the new County Municipal Court was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and the Director of Budget and Purchasing.

Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools, submitted selected statistics for Hennepin County Schools for the years 1963 and 1964.

Said statistics were ordered filed.

Commissioner S. Earl Ainsworth offers the following resolution and moves its adoption:

Whereas, George Scott, the Hennepin County Attorney, has prepared a letter on official County Attorney stationery, soliciting funds to support the campaign of one Robert L. Hoffman for County Commissioner, and

Whereas, this letter, dated September 18, 1964, was distributed by Hoffman or others to attorneys in Hennepin County and, perhaps, other citizens, and clearly suggests that the office of the County Attorney, in its official capacity, is actively campaigning and raising money for Hoffman, and

Whereas, this activity is highly improper on the part of both the $\overline{\text{County}}$ Attorney and Hoffman, since it improperly involves the use of County funds, facilities, power and prestige on behalf of a political candidate, and

Whereas, there is the possibility that the County Attorney and Robert L. Hoffman have violated the laws of the State of Minnesota, including the Corrupt Practices Act, and

Whereas, the County Attorney obviously cannot be asked to investigate his own possible improprieties,

BE IT RESOLVED

That the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners formally request the Hennepin County Bar Association to recommend for appointment a private impartial attorney to investigate the use of County facilities in the campaign of Robert Hoffman, and if a violation of the Corrupt Practices Act is discovered, to initiate proper action to have the name of Robert L. Hoffman removed from the ballot.

Commissioner Ainsworth's resolution was referred to the Committee of the Whole.



WHEREAS, There is on file in the office of the Hennepin County Highway Department a right of way map detailing Parcel No. 1 to 5, Project No. 6219 which are necessary for the purposes herein mentioned; and

WHEREAS, The fee title or easements with respect to all of the parcels on the herein mentioned highway are necessary for the alteration, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance, and safety of travel on said County State Aid Highway No. 18

1. That it is hereby proposed to dissolve said School District No. 565 (French Lake) which comprises the following area:

Township 120, Range 22, South 1/2 Section 19, South 1/2 Section 20, Section 29, Section 30, N.E. 1/4 of N.E. 1/4 Section 31, N.W. 1/4 of N.W. 1/4 Section 32.

- 2. That the territory of said district is proposed to be attached and annexed to Independent School District No. 11 (Anoka-Hennepin).
- 3. That the assets and liabilities, real and personal, of said district to be dissolved, including bonded indebtedness, and the proposed distribution thereof are as follows:
