Tuesday, November 3, 1964

The Board of County Commissioner of the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Richard O. Hanson, Chairman.

A monthly report from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Joseph L. Fox, 4-H Club Agent, Hennepin County Agricultural Extension Service, requesting authorization to attend the Annual Meeting of the National Association of County 4-H Agents to be held November 1 through 5, 1964, at Madison, Wisconsin, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Acting County Highway Administrator, submitting severance payrolls for two County Highway employees were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Stanley R. Cowle, Director, Budget and Purchasing, notifying the Board of the acceptance of the bid furnishing catheter sets, General Hospital, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Erling O. Johnson, Superintendent, Independent School District No. 11, Anoka-Hennepin, submitting action taken by the School Board of Independent School District No. 11 expressing a willingness to accept Common School District No. 565 on the condition they accept their proportionate share of bonded indebtedness of said district was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from Rolland F. Hatfield, Commissioner of Taxation, V State of Minnesota, re the appointment of a county assessing officer was ordered filed.

A letter from Arthur W. McCauley, Attorney, Town of Champlin, requesting for the Town Board of Supervisors of said township copies of the 1965 budget for Hennepin County General Hospital and also for five previous years was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

At 10:15 o'clock A.M., the time specified in the published advertisement for bids, Carl A. Nelson, Assistant Director, Budget and Purchasing, proceeded to open bids for the following:

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for to review the 1965 budget for Hennepin County General Hospital. The Clerk to the Board presented the County Auditor's certificate of mailing the notices of hearing. Resolutions adopted by the governing bodies of the Villages of Richfield and Brooklyn Center and the City of Robbinsdale requesting the County Board to hold a hearing on the 1965 budget for Hennepin County General Hospital, were presented.

Chairman Hanson called for those who wished to be heard on said matter.

Clayton L. LeFevere, Attorney, Village of Richfield, stated that he could not speak for the entire suburban area but as a representative from the Village of Richfield, said village was still opposed to spreading the items in the General Hospital Budget of hospital service for suburban areas and educational expense on an ad valorem basis rather than on a use basis. He said he did

not feel that this was the intent of the legislature when they passed the bill which gave Hennepin County jurisdiction over General Hospital. He said that certain legislators he had discussed the matter with had said that this was not their intent.

Chairman Hanson said that this matter has been resolved in Hennepin County District Court, he also wanted to know the names of the legislators Mr. LeFevere was referring to in his comments. Chairman Hanson further stated, that many legislators he had discussed the matter with said that it was their intent to spread the levy on this basis.

Art Lee, Administrator, Village of Brooklyn Center, also spoke in opposition to spreading the entire General Hospital budget on an ad valorem rather than a use basis.

Owen Stubben, Administrator, General Hospital, stated that as yet they do not have a full years operation of General Hospital on which to compute the next years budget. The 1965 budget was computed using the figures of the first seven (7) months of the 1964 operation of General Hospital.

Chairman Hanson thanked those present for expressing their views and referred the matter to the Committee on Ways and Means.
