Tuesday, February 9, 1965

The Board of County Commissioner of the County of Hennepin,
Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at ten
o'clock A. M., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the February 2, 1965 meeting as published in Finance and Commerce on Saturday February 6, 1965 were approved.

A report from Robert A. Whitaker, Acting Public Examiner, on the financial affairs of Independent School District No. 283 (St. Louis Park) covering the year ended June 30, 1964 was ordered filed

Bonds covering officials and employees of Hennepin County were referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitting claims payable from the Contributions and Awards Fund was referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from James D. Rogers, Judge, Hennepin County Municipal Court and Henry R. Radosevich, Chief Probation Officer, requesting transportation allowance for various court personnel were referred to Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Owen B. Stubben, Administrator, General Hospital,

requesting the Board to seek a formal opinion from the County Attorney on the structure and function of the Hennepin County Mental Health Center Advisory Board was referred to the County Attorney and the Health and Hospitals Advisory Committee.

A letter from Leonard A. Johnson, City Clerk, Minneapolis, submitting action by the City Council regarding distribution of surplus commodities and for food stamps was ordered filed.
