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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 6, 1965

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to law.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the June 22 and 25, 1965, meetings were approved as published in Finance and Commerce on Saturday, June 26 and July 3, 1965 respectively.

A monthly report (June) from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

A Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements of the Hennepin County Historical Society for the year ended December 31, 1964, and Accountants' Opinion prepared by Haskins and Sells, Certified Public Accountants, was ordered filed.

A letter from Tony Hammel, Rangemaster, Hennepin County Pistol Range, submitting a resume of the activities at the Pistol Range for the month of June, 1965 was ordered filed.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Director, Chest Clinic, re the use of County Revenue Funds for the purpose of transporting Jean Dusansky, a patient at Glen Lake State Sanatorium (17 years), to

the National Jewish Hospital in Boulder, Colorado, for further treatment.

Commissioner Hanson moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, that the claim of Glen Lake State Sanatorium in the sum of \$125.00 for the transportation of Jean Dusansky to Boulder, Colorado, pursuant to M.S. 1955, Chapter 376.50, and Attorney General Opinion No. 125A-15, October 11, 1928, and No. 556A-7, June 27, 1951, be approved; and

That the County Auditor be directed to pay said claim from the County Revenue Fund.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Director, Budget and Purchasing, as follows:

- 2. Submitting a list of maintenance improvement projects for various County buildings and institutions to be completed this year.

Mr. Cowle's letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Applications for abatement of assessments, correction of taxes, and homestead classification were referred to the Committee on Taxes.

A letter from Avis P. Nelson, Superintendent of County Schools, re the annexation of Common School District No. 572 (Hennepin County)

to Elk River-Independent School District No. 728 (Sherburne County) and requesting that a date of hearing be set.

Mrs. Nelson also recommended that the case of Rogers and Common School District No. 564-Diamond Lake (Hennepin County) be delayed until a future date.

Commissioner Janes ordered that a date of hearing be set in the matter of Common School District No. 572 on Tuesday, July 27, 1965, at 10:20 o'clock a.m., Commissioners' Committee Room, 130 Court House, Minneapolis. The matter was also referred to the County Attorney.

Stanley Stabno, Representative, District Council No. 3, A.F.S. & M.E., appeared before the Board requesting a hearing re grievances of Local No. 977, General Hospital.

Commissioner Janes ordered that a date of hearing be set on the above matter on Tuesday, July 27, 1965, at 11:15 o'clock a.m., in the Commissioners' Committee Room, 130 Court House, Minneapolis.

F. Gordon Wright, Attorney for Glenn L. Hendrickson, appeared before the Board requesting the matter of signing a release re restoration of the Hendrickson property to its original condition in conjunction with sea wall reconstruction be delayed for two weeks.

Edgar S. Merritt, 97 Spruce Place, Minneapolis, appeared before the Board in re application for relief. The matter was taken under advisement.
