The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Ainsworth, Provo and Chairman Janes.

Members absent: Commissioners Hanson and Mrs. Scott.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the August 31, 1965 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce on Saturday, September 4, 1965.

WHEREAS, The portion of West 44th Street located between France Avenue and Wooddale Avenue within the corporate limits of the Village of Morningside is a main arterial street with public bus transportation serving the residents of the City of Minneapolis, City of St. Louis Park, and the Villages of Morningside and Edina; and

WHEREAS, This portion of West 44th Street has an average vehicular count of 2,000 vehicles per day with the expectancy that this volume will double within the next ten years, and the roadway at present is not constructed to accommodate this volume and has caused a financial hardship to the Village of Morningside for its maintenance: and

WHEREAS, The Village of Morningside under State Law does not have the benefit of receiving state-aid funds, nor does this portion of West 44th Street meet the criteria of becoming a county state aid highway, and has petitioned the Board of County Commissioners for financial aid toward the reconstruction of West 44th Street from France Avenue to Wooddale Avenue; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Laws of Minnesota 1905, Chapter 164, the Board of County Commissioners is empowered to expend funds for repair of roads within the county.

Your committee recommends that pursuant to provisions of Section 471.59 authorizing governmental units to co-operate in the exercise of common powers, the Board of County Commissioners will appropriate to the Village of Morningside a sum of money to pay only the cost of improving the center 24 feet of West 44th Street to accommodate a 9-ton axle load from France Avenue to Wooddale Avenue; and


