Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, January 4, 1966

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor and Secretary to the County Board, and there were present:

Commissioner Richard O. Hanson First District
Commissioner Jack M. Provo Second District
Commissioner Robert P. Janes Third District
Commissioner Mrs. I. G. Scott Fourth District
Commissioner S. E. Ainsworth Fifth District

Mr. Fitzsimmons called for nominations for Chairman of the County Board of Hennepin County for the year 1966.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the voting for Chairman of the County Board be by secret ballot.

Pat McCarty, Reporter, Minneapolis Tribune, raised a question as to the legality of voting by secret ballot and stated that the Minneapolis City Council had been told by its Attorney that such voting is illegal.

Mr. Fitzsimmons then stated that the Board has been electing its Chairman and Vice-Chairman by secret ballot for many years but

that the County Attorney should be asked to submit his opinion on the matter.

John K. Harvey, Assistant County Attorney, said he didn't recall this question ever being raised before and supported Mr. Fitzsimmons' remarks by stating that the County Board has been electing its Chairman and Vice-Chairman by secret ballot for many years.

Mr. Fitzsimmons designated Commissioners Mrs. Scott and Provo to act as tellers. After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced three votes for Commissioner Janes and two blank ballots.

Mr. Fitzsimmons declared Commissioner Janes elected Chairman of the County Board for the year 1966. Chairman Janes then took the chair and called for the election of a Vice-Chairman of the County Board for the ensuing year.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the voting for Vice-Chairman of the County Board be by secret ballot. He designated Commissioners Mrs. Scott and Provo to act as tellers.

After tallying the ballots, the tellers announced three votes for Commissioner Provo and two blank ballots.

Chairman Janes then declared Commissioner Provo elected Vice-Chairman of the County Board for the year 1966.


