Tuesday, February 8, 1966

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.

The meeting was called to order by Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor and Secretary to the County Board, and there were present:

Mr. Fitzsimmons stated that pursuant to an opinion from the County Attorney, dated January 21, 1966, the election held on January 4, 1966, for Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the County Board for the year 1966 was not valid since it was done by secret (written) ballot.

Mr. Fitzsimmons then called for nominations for Chairman of the County Board for 1966.

Commissioner Provo nominated Commissioner Janes.

There being no other nominations a motion was made, seconded and carried that the nominations be closed.

Mr. Fitzsimmons then called for a roll call on the nomination

of Commissioner Janes as Chairman for 1966 and the vote was as follows:




