Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 5, 1966

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Provo, Mrs. Scott, and Chairman Janes.

Member absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the March 29, 1966 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, April 2, 1966.

A financial report on Hennepin County General Hospital for the year 1964 was received from the State Public Examiner and ordered filed.

A monthly report from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

A letter from Richard J. Fitzgerald, Attorney, requesting a right-of-way easement on behalf of Fabri-Tek, Inc. located on C.S.A.H. No. 18 was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes and the Highway Department.

Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, submitted the following:
