Tuesday, July 5, 1966

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at ten o'clock A.M., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Provo, Mrs. Scott and Chairman Janes.

Members absent: Commissioner Ainsworth.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the June 28, 1966 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, July 2, 1966.

A monthly report from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

The minutes of the quarterly meeting of the Twin Cities Metropolitan Planning Commission held on March 2, 1966, were ordered filed.

A letter from Walter Wheeler, Consulting Engineer, submitting three sketches for proposed bridge crossing of East Hennepin Avenue over the Mississippi River was referred to the Highway Department.

A letter from A. A. Kordiak, Chairman, Anoka County Board, re testing and x-rays for detection of tuberculosis was referred to the Chest Clinic and Budget and Purchasing Office.

That Mr. Melberg openly admitted to the operation of a County vehicle while


