Tuesday, August 9, 1966

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock A.M., pursuant to adjournment.





WHEREAS, The re-apportionment act of the legislature of the State of Minnesota changed the boundaries of the legislative district in the Village of Minnetonka, and

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

3. Applications for abatement of assessments, correction of taxes and homestead classification. Referred to the Committee on Taxes.

A letter from O. J. Kaasa, County Treasurer, re exchange of collateral security on County deposits was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Paul J. Vogt, Administrator, County General Hospital, requesting travel authorization for a hospital employee was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Walter P. Halstead, Director, Civil Defense, requesting travel authorization for himself and Maxwell D. Seeker, Deputy Director, Civil Defense, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A request for transportation allowance (\$20 per month) for caseworkers in the County Welfare Department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters from A. J. Lee, Administrator, County Highway Department, submitting the following:

1. Agreements for bridge construction, C.S.A.H. No. 146, and division of cost for improvement of a portion of C.S.A.H. No. 61 and bridge construction.

2. Right-of-way documents.

Mr. Lee's letters were referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Letters from Stanley R. Cowle, Director, Budget and Purchasing, as follows:

1. Notifying the Board of the acceptance of the bid for rental of equipment for work in Lake Minnetonka and requesting that funds be set aside to pay said award.

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2. Submitting contract and performance bonds.

3. Submitting specifications for Food Products, Fourth Quarter, 1966, General Hospital.

Mr. Cowle's letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:20 o'clock A.M., hearing was called for on the petition of Andrew A. Westlin, asking that his land described in said petition be set-off from School District No. 570 (Oakdale) to Independent School District No. 877 (Buffalo) in Wright County.

The Clerk to the Board presented the publisher's affidavit of printing the notice of hearing, the Sheriff's return of posting and the County Auditor's certificate of mailing said notices.

A letter was read from Avis P. Nelson, County Superintendent of Schools, submitting the recommendation of the Hennepin County School Survey Committee favoring Mr. Westlin's request for detachment.

A letter was read from A. D. Cummings, Superintendent, Independent School District No. 877 (Buffalo) in which Mr. Cummings stated that the school district will not accept the transfer.

No one appeared in opposition to the granting of the petition.

John DeMoss, Attorney, representing the Nicollet Island Business Men's Association, appeared concerning the proposed plans for the East Hennepin Avenue crossing of the Mississippi River. He stated there were many plans for this improvement, causing considerable confusion, but that they all would remove property from the tax rolls, thereby causing the island to "die" economically.

Mr. DeMoss introduced James Tillitt an associate with the engineering firm of Walter H. Wheeler who submitted several plans proposed by his firm and the firm of Edwards and Kelcey and stated that Alternate Plan No. 4 was the best solution for moving the largest volume of traffic. He further stated that their proposed plans would remove only vacant property from the tax rolls. He said that no matter which plan is used the bottleneck at First Street North and Hennepin Avenue will still remain.

Paul Dan Rosso presented a map prepared by the City Engineer, Minneapolis, showing the projected traffic volume on East Hennepin Avenue to the year 1980 being 1500 to 3000 vehicles per day less than at the present time, and stated that all of the plans submitted by Walter Wheeler and Edwards and Kelcey will accommodate a greater traffic volume than is projected for 1980.

John Erdman of the Edwards and Kelcey firm stated that the basis for the plans submitted by his firm was only on traffic volume.

Mr. DeMoss stated that the plan (Plan No. 1) approved by the City of Minneapolis would cost, on the basis of \$22.50 per square foot, approximately \$1,250,000.00 and "our" plan (Plan No. 2) would cost approximately \$860,000.00.

Ed Straus, representing the Nicollet Island Business Men's Association, submitted a report of the Minneapolis Housing and Redevelopment Authority (1959) which listed Nicollet Island as an area to be redeveloped and stated that no matter how the island is redeveloped or beautified certain buildings will remain in view which will mar the aesthetic value of any beautification program (B.F. Nelson Company and Northern States Power Company) and submitted pictures (3) to substantiate his statement. He also submitted a

proposed plan compiled by students at De La Salle High School for redeveloping the island. He requested the Board to reconsider its plans for the bridge and give it serious consideration before proceeding.

Miss Senwick of the Lutheran Mission spoke of the work of the mission on the island and stated that their present location is ideal. She said that attempts have been made to find another suitable location but thus far they have been unsuccessful. She said "we don't know much about bridges, but we do know something about human beings and we feel that if we are forced to move our work will be seriously hampered."

Mr. Rosso stated that the existing bridge is adequate for present and future needs and the Board should seek bids to repair it. He also submitted a report from the Minnesota Highway Department.

Mr. De Moss reaffirmed Mr. Rosso's statement about the adequacy of the existing bridge and implored the Board to reconsider its plans.

Chairman Janes expressed the Board's thanks for the informative presentation and said that final authority on the matter rests with the City of Minneapolis. The matter was referred to the County Highway Department for analysis and study.
