II TERMS OF THE PROPOSAL:

- A. Permanent full-time employees will be furnished three uniforms upon employment. These employees will be given one replacement uniform annually on anniversary date (one year after completion of probation); should it become necessary in certain classifications for additional uniforms to be replaced, the matter will be reviewed and presented to the County Board for approval. Employees will launder their own uniforms and may purchase additional or replacement sets from the Hospital at cost. If the employee is separated during his probationary period, he shall return the uniforms or reimburse the Hospital for cost of issue;
- B. Permanent part-time employees will be furnished two uniforms upon employment. These employees will be given one replacement uniform annually (every 2,080 hours worked) after completion of probationary period. All other conditions will be applicable as for full-time employees;

II TERMS OF THE PROPOSAL (Cont'd):

C. Temporary full-time employees will be furnished three uniforms upon employment, which will be returned on separation or the hospital reimbursed for cost of issue;

D. Name Tags:

- 1. All employees will wear standard name tags unless otherwise suitably indentified. Employees presently having their own name tags may continue to wear them on approval of their supervisor;
- 2. Hennepin County General Hospital will furnish the initial standard name tag at no charge to the employee;
- 3. Name tags lost or damaged by the employee will be replaced at a cost of 25ϕ to the employee.

III THE ECONOMICS OF THE PROPOSAL:

- A. To provide initial issue for estimated 375 employees at \$15.00 per employee = \$5,625.00;
- B. Annual issue thereafter for new employees at \$15.00 per employee X estimated turnover of 200 in designated classes= \$3,000.00.

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 9:30 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Provo, Mrs. Scott, Robb, and Chairman Janes.

Member absent: Commissioner Hanson.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

On November 23, 1965 the board entered into a contract with S.U.A., Inc., Beverly Hills, California, for a study of space utilization in various buildings and facilities in Hennepin County, as well as a program of additional building needs projected to the year 1990. Chairman Janes called on Walter C. Jacobs, President, S.U.A., Inc., to make an oral presentation of their report on the study.

Mr. Jacobs thanked the board, officials, staff members and employees for their cooperation in the preparation of the report. He said they spent four to five weeks gathering statistics and then returned to their offices in Beverly Hills for analysis and preparation of the report.

He said their demographers project for the year 1990 a popu-

lation of 1,532,450 for the County, and a population of 670,000 for the City of Minneapolis. Presently 1,910 people are employed by the County, but in 1990 there will be 4,236 employees. The present average annual salary per county employee is \$7,350.00, which is slightly higher than the national average, in 1990 it will be \$12,000, again higher than the national average.

Today the County occupies 436,000 square feet of floor space, although it should have approximately 700,000 square feet. In 1970 it will require 1,000,000 square feet and in 1990 will need 1,200,000.

Among the recommendations listed in the report were consolidation of the District Court and Municipal Court Probation Offices, Clerks of Court, jails, establishment of an Alcoholic Rehabilitation Center and a Huber Law Work Furlough Program in the present facilities of the Juvenile Center, Shelter Care Home and Morgue. In 1973 a new Home School is recommended at the site of the present Juvenile Center.

He said the cost of renovating the Court House would cost \$40 to \$50 per square foot with the result that the facilities would be less than adequate. He said the construction of a new Courts Facilities Building (17 stories) would cost \$30 per square foot and should be started immediately.

He also recommended that the Welfare, Register of Deeds and Data Processing departments occupy the present Court House until 1975 when a new administrative building (8 stories) should be constructed. The fifth floor of the present Court House could then be used as an archives center, which will require 80,000 square feet by 1990. He recommended the immediate utilization of a microfilming program.

Mr. Jacobs said that the cost of implementing the recommendation in the report would cost \$39,947,877.

Chairman Janes commended Mr. Jacobs for the comprehensiveness of his report and said it would be taken under advisement.

The County Board adjourned until Monday, January 23, 1967 at 10:00 o'clock a.m.


