Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 14, 1967

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioner Hanson, Provo, Mrs. Scott, and Chairman Janes.

Member absent: Commissioner Robb.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the March 7, 1967 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, March 11, 1967.

A bill for an act relating to the membership of cities, villages, boroughs, and counties in regional associations; amending Minnesota Statutes 1965, Sec. 471.96, was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

A letter from Walter P. Quist, Chairman, Board of Governors, Big Island Veterans Camp, re the County's annual appropriation was referred to the Budget and Purchasing Director. A Statement of Balances in County Revenue Allowance from Robert F. Fitzsimmons, County Auditor, was ordered published and filed.

Letters from Elmer H. Larson, Land Commissioner, submitting applications for repurchase of tax-forfeited land were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.
