\$35.00 additional per month shall be granted to Associate, Staff and Head Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses and Registered Medical Technologists who work evening or night shifts.

Associate, Staff and Head Nurses who are employed 40 hours or more per pay period and who are required to work more than 2 Sundays in 4 shall be paid an additional \$10.00 for each Sunday worked.

Staff Nurses who take the position or perform the duty of a Head Nurse continuously for a period of 6 working days or more will receive a salary of a Head Nurse for the period during which she functions in this capacity.

All Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Nurse Aides and Hospital Orderlies assigned to the care of patients in the Adult Isolation Station shall be paid \$20.00 per month more than the regular pay schedule.

All Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses and Surgical Technicians on call for services in Operating Rooms and Obstetrics shall be paid \$1.00 for each hour on call. Such on call pay shall not be granted for hours actually worked.

Medical Technologists when assigned additional teaching duties in the General Hospital School of Medical Technology will be paid at the rate of \$35.00 per month.

Commissioner Provo , Chairman, Committee on Ways and Means, presented the following report: WHEREAS, The Hennepin County Personnel Board on October 19, 1967, adopted the new class of Auto-Analyzer Operator; and WHEREAS, The Personnel Board has recommended to this Board approval of the new class and salary range assignment; Your committee recommends that the class of Auto-Analyzer Operator with the salary range assignment of \$505 - \$613 per month be approved and added to the classification and salary plan.
