Mr. Blesi stated that the compactor his firm proposed to furnish does meet the specifications, but he felt the specifications were too narrow in their scope. He demonstrated his machine by using a model and stated that his machine would outperform the one to be furnished by Refuse Consultants, Inc.

Dave Mina, Representative, Dumpster, Inc., and Joe Polansky, Refuse Consultants, Inc., spoke in support of accepting the bid of Refuse Consultants,

Commissioner Robb, Chairman, Committee on Roads and Lakes, presented the following report:

WHEREAS, Hennepin County has abandoned the use of six wells previously used for supplementing the water supply to Lake Minnetonka and other lakes in the Minnehaha Creek Watershed; and

WHEREAS, The County of Hennepin does not intend to use the wells for that purpose in the future; and

WHEREAS, Five of the wells are located on tracts of land so small that they are not in themselves suitable for other public use by Hennepin County; and

WHEREAS, The well at Grays Bay Dam is on a tract of land which must be reserved by Hennepin County to provide access to the Grays Bay Dam; and

WHEREAS, The Minnehaha Creek Watershed District wishes to secure control of the wells for observation purposes and possible use as a means of supplementing the water supply in the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District.

Your committee recommends, pursuant to a recommendation from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works and Acting County Engineer, that the County of Hennepin transfer Hennepin County well properties one (1) through five (5) to the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District, and that an easement be granted to the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District for the maintenance of a well on Grays Bay Dam well property No. 7, and that the Chairman of the Board be authorized and directed to execute the appropriate deeds and easement.

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Commissioner Robb, Chairman, Committee on Roads and Lakes, presented the following report:

WHEREAS, The 1967 Legislature revised the Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 169.86, to allow the collection of a permit fee for the issuance of permits for the transportation of overweight, overwidth, overheight and overlength loads over highways under the jurisdiction of the county; and

WHEREAS, It is desirable to control the movement of such overweight, overwidth, overheight and overlength loads to promote the safety of the travelling public and to preserve the structural condition of the highways; and

WHEREAS, The Hennepin County Highway Department has been issuing such permits and there is involved a considerable expenditure of time in the administration of the permits; and

WHEREAS, It is determined that it is reasonable to collect a permit fee of \$5.00 at the time each permit is issued to defray a portion of the cost of permit administration.

Pursuant to a recommendation from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works and Acting County Engineer, your committee recommends that the Board of County Commissioners direct the Director of Public Works to establish policy for the issuance of transportation permits, and authorize the collection of a \$5.00 permit fee for the issuance of a transportation permit.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE FORM AND TERMS OF \$8,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF HENNEPIN COUNTY DATED JANUARY 1, 1968, PROVIDING FOR THEIR EXECUTION AND DELIVERY AND LEVYING TAXES FOR THEIR PAYMENT

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, as follows:

l. Pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 47, Sections 1 and 2 and Minnesota Statutes 1965, Chapter 475 and other applicable law, and for the purposes authorized in said Chapter 47, the Board has duly authorized, advertised and contracted to sell General Obligation Bonds of Hennepin County in the aggregate principal amount of \$8,000,000, to be dated as of January 1, 1968, and to be issued upon the further terms and conditions which are set forth in this resolution. The bonds thus authorized and sold shall be issued in the denomination of \$5,000 each, numbered serially from 1 to 1600, inclusive, shall mature in order of their serial numbers on January 1 in the respective years and amounts stated below, without option of prior payment, and shall bear interest at the respective annual rates indicated opposite their maturity years:

the principal amount, only, of each bond shall be registrable on the books and records of the County to be maintained by the County Treasurer, with the force and effect stated in the form of bond set forth below. The text of the legal opinion given by bond counsel on the issue shall be printed on the reverse side of each bond.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the County of Hennepin, a duly organized and existing county of the State of Minnesota whose county seat is at Minneapolis, Minnesota, acknowledges itself to be indebted and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer or, if transfer of ownership of the principal amount of this bond has been registered in the manner described below, to the registered owner hereof, the sum of

For the prompt and full payment of such principal and interest as they respectively become due, the full faith and credit and taxing powers of the County have been and are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This bond is one of a series in the aggregate principal amount of \$8,000,000, all of like date and tenor except as to serial number, maturity date and interest rate, all issued for the purpose of providing funds for acquisition and betterment of a building to house courts and court-related functions and for highway acquisition and construction, and is issued pursuant to and in full conformity with the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota thereunto enabling, including Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 and Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 47.

The transfer of ownership of the principal amount hereof may be registered by the bearer on the books of the County at the Courthouse, Minneapolis, Minnesota, by presenting this bond for registration to the County Treasurer, who will note the date of registration and the name of the transferee in the registration blank on the reverse side hereof. Thereafter this bond may be transferred to a bona fide purchaser only by delivery with an assignment duly executed by the registered owner

or his agent, and the County may treat the registered owner as the person exclusively entitled to exercise all the rights and powers of an owner until this bond is presented with such assignment for registration of transfer, accompanied by assurance of the nature provided by law that the assignment is genuine and effective, and until such transfer is registered on said books and noted hereon by the Treasurer. Such transfer may be to bearer, and thereby the transferability of this bond by delivery shall be restored, but the bond may again and from time to time be registered in the name of a holder or to bearer as before. Notwithstanding the registration of this bond as to principal, the interest coupons appurtenant hereto shall always continue to be payable to bearer and transferable by delivery.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota to be done, to exist, to happen and to be performed, in order to make this bond a valid and binding general obligation according to its terms, have been done, do exist, have happened and have been performed in due form, time and manner as so required; that, prior to the issuance hereof, a direct, annual, irrepealable, ad valorem tax has been duly levied upon all of the taxable properties in the County of Hennepin, for the years and in amounts at least 5% in excess of the amounts required to pay the interest hereon and the principal hereof when and as such payments fall due; that additional taxes, if needed for this purpose, are required by law to be levied on all of said properties and are not subject to any limitation of rate or amount; and that the issuance of this bond did not cause the indebtedness of the County to exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation.

- 3. The bonds shall be prepared for execution under the direction of the County Administrator, fiscal agent and attorneys, and shall then be executed in behalf of the County by the signature of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, attested by the signature of the County Administrator, and sealed with the official seal; and the interest coupons shall be executed and authenticated by the signatures of said Chairman and Administrator. On the reverse side of each bond shall be printed a full, true and correct copy of the approving opinion to be rendered by bond counsel, followed by the certificate executed by the signatures of the Chairman and Administrator. The seal and all signatures appearing on the bonds and coupons shall be printed, lithographed or engraved facsimiles of the originals thereof, except that the Administrator shall manually sign each bond on its face. When the bonds have been so executed and authenticated, the County Treasurer shall deliver them or cause them to be delivered to the purchaser on receipt of the purchase price heretofore agreed upon, and the purchaser shall not be obligated to see to the application thereof.
- 4. In accordance with the provisions of Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 47, Section 1, the terms of the series of bonds herein authorized have been established so that the principal of and interest on all such bonds due in any year will not exceed two and one-half mills times the assessed value of all taxable property in the County as last finally equalized prior to the issuance of this series. The maximum amount of such principal and interest to become due in any year is computed to be \$981,225 , due in the calendar year 1971. The assessed value of all taxable property in the County, as equalized by the State Commissioner of Taxation in 1967 pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Sections 270.11 to 270.13, including therein the assessed value similarly equalized in 1966 of property exempted from taxation by Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 32 but required by Article XV of said Chapter 32 to be so included, is determined to be \$754,443,220, and two and one-half mills times this aggregate value is accordingly \$1,886,108.
- 5. In accordance with the provisions of Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 47, Section 3, the Board has by resolution adopted November 14 , 1967, levied a direct general ad valorem tax upon all taxable property in the County for the purposes of the County Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund, to be used for the construction, maintenance and equipping of such county buildings as are now or hereafter may be constructed or maintained by the Board. From the collections of this tax, when received in said fund, the sum of \$331,200 is irrevocably appropriated and shall be transferred to the sinking fund referred to below, said sum being approximately 105% of the amount required to pay interest due January 1, 1969, on the bonds herein authorized. The County recognizes the further requirement contained in Section 3 of said Chapter 47, that the amount of the tax to be levied for the Reserve Building and Maintenance Fund in 1968 and in each future year is limited to two and one-half mills times the assessed value of that year, less the amount levied and to be extended on the tax rolls of that year for the payment of the bonds herein authorized and interest thereon, as required by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 and by paragraph 6 below.

6. For the prompt and full payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds herein authorized, as such payments respectively become due, the full faith and credit and unlimited taxing powers of the County are irrevocably pledged. As long as any of said bonds herein authorized are outstanding and unpaid, the County shall maintain a sinking fund as a separate and special bookkeeping account on its official books and records, for the sole purpose of paying principal and interest on general obligations of the County, including the issue herein authorized. To provide money for this purpose, in addition to the sum appropriated to the sinking fund in paragraph 5 above, there is hereby levied on all taxable property in the County a direct, annual ad valorem tax to be extended on the tax rolls prepared in each of the years 1968 through 1979 in the following respective amounts, to be collected with and as a part of other general taxes of the County in the respective ensuing years:

The proceeds of all such taxes shall be paid into said sinking fund, together with all other taxes levied and to be levied for the payment of other obligations made payable from the fund, and all accrued interest and principal received as part of the purchase price of such obligations, and all other money from time to time received for or appropriated to the payment of such obligations. If any payment of principal or interest on such obligations shall become due when there is not sufficient money in the sinking fund, the Treasurer shall pay the same from any other fund or funds of the County, and such fund or funds may be reimbursed for such advances out of the taxes levied for the sinking fund. The tax levied in this paragraph 6 shall be irrepealable as long as any of the bonds herein authorized are outstanding and unpaid, except that the County reserves the right and power to reduce the levies annually in the manner and to the extent permitted by Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.61.

- 7. The County Administrator is directed to file with the County Auditor of Hennepin County before the delivery of the bonds a certified copy of this resolution, together with such other information as the Auditor may require, and to obtain from the Auditor a certificate that the tax required by law for payment of the bonds has been levied and that the bonds have been entered upon his bond register.
- 8. The officers of the County are authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the purchaser of the bonds, and to the attorneys approving the legality of their issuance, certified copies of all such proceedings and records of the County relating to the bonds and to its organization, financial condition and affairs, and affidavits, certificates and information relating to all such other matters, as may be required to evidence the legality and marketability of the bonds,

as such matters appear from the books and records in the custody and control of the officers or are otherwise known to them; and all such certified copies, certificates and affidavits, including any heretofore furnished, shall constitute representations of the County as to the truth of the facts purported to be shown thereby.

any improvements made upon the land or to the wells, pumps or pump houses shall become the property of the County without compensation to the Minnehaha Watershed District, and the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District, in consideration of the acceptance, use and operation of the land, wells, pumps and pump houses, as provided in this resolution, agrees and binds itself to defend and save harmless the County of Hennepin for any and all damages or causes of action arising from their use and occupancy of the premises by them, their employees, or any member of the public who is injured or suffers any damage by virtue of the operation of the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District of the described premises.
