Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, April 2, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Robb and Mrs. Scott

The meeting was called to order by E. F. Robb, Jr., Vice-Chairman.

WHEREAS, although the highway and traffic safety problem has had the attention of many groups, both governmental and non-governmental, the attention has been fragmented because each unit has been limited to its particular jurisdiction, and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.59 authorized governmental units to join together in the exercise of powers common to such units, and

WHEREAS, individual counties are empowered by law to take appropriate action as necessary in matters relating to highway and traffic safety, and

WHEREAS, it is the belief of the eight counties of the Minneapolis-St. Paul metropolitan area that highway and traffic safety programs may most effectively be developed and maintained on a regional basis, and by joint effort of the counties concerned, and

WHEREAS, federal funds in support of highway and traffic safety programs are available to governmental units acting jointly upon application under the Federal Highway Safety Act of 1966,

Your committee recommends that the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County pledges to join in agreement with other counties in the metropolitan area in attacking this major problem, in which agreement the chairman of the respective county boards shall be designated as signator for the county.

Your committee further recommends that in such agreement the Metropolitan Inter-County Council shall be designated as agent of the county to develop plans for a regional highway and traffic safety program involving both counties and municipalities in the area, and that in such agreement the Metropolitan Inter-Council shall be authorized and designated to apply for, and receive, any federal funds available for such purposes to counties within the area.


