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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 21, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Provo, Mrs. Scott and Robb

Member absent: Commissioner Janes

The meeting was called to order by E. F. Robb, Jr., Vice-Chairman.

The minutes of the May 14, 1968, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce Saturday, May 18, 1968.

A Statement of Balances in County Revenue Allowances (April 30, 1968) received from George B. Hickey, County Auditor, was ordered published and filed.

Minutes of the meetings of the Metropolitan Council held on April 4 and 18, 1968, were ordered filed.

A monthly jail report (April, 1968) from Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff, was ordered filed.

A letter from Elmer H. Larson, Deputy County Auditor, regarding an easement to the Rural Cooperative Power Association of Elk River, Minnesota, was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Purchasing Manager, as follows:

- 1. Regarding the allocation of funds for aerial surveys.
- 2. Regarding the Sheriff's Contingency Fund.
- 3. Requesting transportation allowance for Civil Defense employees.

- 4. Requesting travel authorization for various County employees.
- 5. Submitting Change Order No. E-3 for construction of the Highway Building addition.
- 6. Submitting Building and Equipment Fund claims.
- 7. Submitting contracts and performance bonds.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was received from Dr. W. J. Warwick, Director, Pediatric Chest Clinic, University of Minnesota Hospitals, requesting the County to purchase home therapy equipment for Kenneth Hubbell in the sum of approximately \$300.
