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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, June 25, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Members present: Commissioners Hanson, Provo, Robb and Mrs. Scott.

Member absent: Chairman Janes.

The meeting was called to order by E. F. Robb, Jr., Vice-Chairman.

The minutes of the June 18, 1968 meeting were approved as published in Finance & Commerce, Saturday, June 22, 1968.
