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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, July 23, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

A letter from Al Hilde, Jr., Mayor, Village of Plymouth, regarding the Plymouth Pride Force dealing with pollution problems was ordered filed.

A letter from George B. Hickey, Secretary, Municipal Building Commission, submitting the 1969 budget request for the MBC was referred to the County Administrator.

Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 6, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to law.

Members present: Commissioners Mrs. Scott, Janes, Robb, Hanson Member absent: Commissioner Provo

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the July 23, 1968 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce on July 27, 1968.

A monthly report (July, 1968) from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

A report from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency recommending control practices concerning the exterior storage of road salts or other chemicals was referred to the Highway Department.

A monthly financial statement (June, 1968) and minutes of the July 2, 1968 meeting of the Hennepin County Library Board were ordered filed.

The minutes of the June 11 and 25, 1968 meetings of the Metropolitan Transit Commission were ordered filed.

A letter from Richard Johansen, City Clerk, Minneapolis, submitting Council action approving the agreement with Hennepin County for the improvement of C.S.A.H. #52 was ordered filed.

A letter from N. T. Waldor, Minnesota Commissioner of Highways, regarding the Bureau of Public Roads Operations Plans for continuing Urban Transportation Planning was referred to the Highway Department.

A claim for damages from Mary Kalliman, etal, 1216 W. 31st Street, Minneapolis, in the sum of \$35,000.00 was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from James L. Hetland, Jr., Chairman, Metropolitan Council, submitting a Notice of Review on the comprehensive plan of the Village of Excelsior was referred to the Highway Department.

A letter from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, submitting proposed personnel rule changes was ordered filed.

A letter from Paul J. Vogt, General Hospital Administrator, submitting a contract with Dr. V. K. Funk for furnishing consulting services to the Chest Clinic was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Jewell Goddard, Director, Court Services, notifying the Board of the receipt of funds donated to the Youth Rehabilitation Program Fund was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. Thomas F. Mulrooney, Director, Chest Clinic, submitting applications for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator and Richard Bardon, Jr., Purchasing Manager, as follows:

- 1) Notifying the Board of the acceptance of various bids and recommending that funds be set aside to pay the awards.
- Recommending the cancellation of the contract with Farnham's,
 Inc., for office furniture.
 - 3) Submitting Reserve Building & Maintenance Fund claims.
- 4) Requesting the transfer of funds from the Auditor's Equipment Rental Account.
 - 5) Requesting travel authorization for various employees.
 - 6) Submitting contracts and performance bonds.
 - 7) Submitting specifications on the following items:
 - a. Wall washing General Hospital
- b. Movable type partitions General Hospital The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was received from Roy Swenson, Clerk-Administrator, Village of Minnetonka, submitting for reviewal an application for a State Natural Resources Fund grant in the sum of \$50,000.00

Commissioner Robb moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrs. Scott, that the application be approved and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the application on behalf of Hennepin County.

Motion carried.

Commissioner Janes , Vice-Chairman, Committee on Ways and Means, presented the following report:

WHEREAS, The County of Hennepin is currently planning a comprehensive physical construction program of which jail facilities are an integral part, and

WHEREAS, Both the District and Municipal Courts are established on a County wide basis, and

WHEREAS, Consolidation of jail facilities has been urged by numerous committees, including the City-County Jail Study Committee, the Citizens League's Minneapolis-Hennepin County Jails Committee, the Hennepin County Grand Jury and SUA, Inc. Space Consultants, and

WHEREAS, Consolidation as soon as practically possible would be beneficial immediately in regard to the holding of prisoners, potential cost savings and for experience in administration of the new single facility for City and County jails now being planned.

Your committee recommends that the City and County jails as now located on the fifth floor of the Court House-City Hall be consolidated under the direct administration of the Hennepin County Sheriff effective January 1, 1969, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Recognizing the practical difficulties in attempting to consolidate the records of the two jails, the Minneapolis Police Department may at its option continue to staff and maintain their own Records unit. The County Sheriff shall staff and maintain the booking funtion and he shall provide copies of any records pertaining to prisoners of the Minneapolis Police Department that the Chief of Police may request. However, it is hereby agreed that the Sheriff of Hennepin County and the Minneapolis Police Chief shall by January 1, 1970, submit their joint proposal for the eventual consolidation of the agencies' records units, whether through the use of computers or standard files, to the respective governing bodies that are parties to this resolution.

2. The Hennepin County Sheriff will provide for all staffing of the consolidated jail with the Minneapolis Patrolmen and Clerks currently employed in the City jail operation transferred to other operating units of the Minneapolis Police Department and the County to have no responsibility for their placement or job duties. However, recognizing the special situation of the six matrons of the Minneapolis Police Department employed in the Jail, the following provision shall apply:

Any currently employed Matron in the Minneapolis Police Department who as of May 1, 1968, is assigned to the Minneapolis Jail shall:

- A. As of the effective date of this consolidation be assigned to any matron vacancy that shall exist in any other Police Department unit, or
- B. At the request of any such matron terminate employment with the City of Minneapolis and be immediately employed in the service of Hennepin County as a matron in the jail, or

- C. At the request of any such matron who cannot be placed in a comparable position in any other City activity, be retained by the City of Minneapolis and contracted to the County of Hennepin for duty as a jail matron until such time as any matron so contracted for shall resign or retire from that position.
- 3. Records shall be maintained by the Hennepin County Sheriff so that prisoners accused of misdemeanors and ordinance violations whose cases will finally be disposed of in Hennepin County Municipal Court, shall be costed back to the community where the alleged violation occurred. Costs of keeping prisoners accused of gross misdemeanors and felonies, whose cases potentially will be disposed of in Hennepin County District Court, shall be a general County obligation. The Hennepin County Sheriff shall at the end of each month, submit to the County Auditor, based on prisoner days multiplied by the per diem rate, the cost of keeping prisoners charged with misdemeanors and ordinance violations by community, and the County Auditor shall reduce each municipality's revenue from Municipal Court fines accordingly. Costs of prisoner care shall be established as of December 1 of the preceding year and shall remain effective throughout the calendar year.

Costs for prisoner care shall be computed by dividing the total operating expense of the Hennepin County Jail by the total days of prisoner care provided for the most immediate preceding full calendar year. Operating expense shall mean

total salaries and wages plus employer contributions for retirement and insurance related thereto; one-fifth of the expenditures for items costing more than \$25.00 with a useful life in excess of one year; the MBC maintenance cost for space occupied by the jail; the total expenditures for all items of current expense of the jail, that is, all items of food, cleaning, drugs, travel, etc., that are purchased and consumed or used on a current basis. Prisoner days shall be computed on the basis of a daily 1:30 p.m. prisoner count.

- 4. The Police Department of the City of Minneapolis shall be assigned space suitable to the Chief of Police for the purpose of showup, Bureau of Identification, and interview rooms for use by the Minneapolis Police Department.
- 5. In keeping with the spirit of cooperation in this resolution, the officers and men of the Minneapolis Police Department shall, whenever their official duties require, be afforded every convenience and courtesy by the Sheriff of Hennepin C ounty that is consistent with and necessary to the efficiency and effectiveness of the police responsibility of the City of Minneapolis.
