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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, August 20, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the August 13, 1968 meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce Saturday, August 17, 1968.

A letter from Ervin J. Gaines, Director, Minneapolis Public Library, requesting the re-appointment of Ralph Forester for a three-year term as one of the representatives from Minneapolis Public Library Board. Commissioner Mrs. Scott moved, seconded by Commissioner Robb that Mr. Forester be reappointed. Motion unanimously carried.

The monthly jail report for July, 1968, from Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff, was ordered filed.

A letter from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, requesting travel authorization for himself and two members of the Personnel Board was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A Notice of Continued Hearing from Irving R. Keldsen, Secretary,
Minnesota Municipal Commission, in the matter of the petition for the incorporation of the Village of Mississippi Park in the County of Hennepin was ordered filed.

WHEREAS, The Attorney General of the State of Minnesota has filed an antitrust suit in Federal Court for the Southern District of New York against certain drug manufacturers alleging that Chas. Pfizer & Co., Inc., American Cyanamid Company, Bristol-Myers Company, Olin Mathieson Chemical Corp., and The Upjohn Company violated the antitrust laws in the sale of certain antibiotics, directly and indirectly, to the State and its political subdivisions between 1953 and 1966; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the County of Hennepin is an affected purchaser of antibiotics either directly or indirectly from one or more said defendants, and has expended funds for the distribution of antibiotics to welfare recipients,
