A letter from Leslie C. Smith, Administrative Assistant, City of Wayzata, submitting a copy of the Wayzata City Council's resolution supporting the establishment of mental health facilities in western Hennepin County was referred to the Hennepin County Mental Health Advisory Committee.

A letter from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, requesting Board approval of the Personnel Board action changing four personnel rules was referred to the Committee of the Whole.

Pursuant to a recommendation from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, your committee recommends that the following document be accepted and recorded:

An easement agreement from Alton H. Sanders, Edith E. Sanders, Russell E. McMains and Dorothy Marsh McMains to construct and maintain a sidewalk, including other necessary appurtenances upon the following described property:

That part of the Southwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 26, Township 28, Range 24, described as follows: Commencing at a point 33 feet North of, and 33 feet East of the Quarter Corner on the West side of said Section 26; thence North Parallel with and 33 feet East of the West line of said Section 26 a distance of 176.12 feet; thence East Parallel with the East and West quarter line of said Section 26 a distance of 247.3 feet; thence South parallel with the West line of said Section 26 a distance of 176.12 feet to a point 33 feet North of the East and West quarter line through said Section 26; thence West parallel with the East and West quarter line through said Section 26, a distance of 247.3 feet to the point of beginning, except the North 51 feet of the West 125 feet thereof, and except that part thereof lying East of the West 125 feet thereof, according to the Government Survey thereof,

which lies Southwesterly of a curve concave to the Northeast having a radius of 9.35 feet and being tangent to the South and West line of said tract.

Also an easement for the installation and maintenance of a traffic signal control box on the North 5 feet of the South 15 feet of the West 4.5 feet of the first above described tract.

Together with a temporary right of entree for construction purposes over the West 15 feet of the South 30 feet of the first above described tract.

Said temporary right to expire December 31, 1970,

together with the right of ingress to and egress from and upon such easement strip as may be necessary to Grantee's proper exercise of the easements hereby granted. Grantee may replace the sidewalk and traffic signal control-box, without interruption to service. Grantee, in accepting these easements, hereby agrees that any and all damages caused by construction and maintenance will be paid for by it or repaired or replaced to Grantor's satisfaction.

Grantee shall indemnify Grantor against any and all claims, suits, loss, cost and liability on account of injury or death of person or damage to property caused by the sole negligence of Grantee, in connection with the exercise by Grantee of any of its rights hereunder.
