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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, March 25, 1969

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Robert P. Janes, Chairman.

The minutes of the Metropolitan Council meetings of January 9, 23, 30, February 13 and 27, 1969, were ordered filed.

A Petition from the State of Minnesota for Right to Make Changes in County Ditch No. 32 from Gerald H. Geheren, Special Assistant Attorney General, was referred to the County Attorney and the Director of Public Works.

An application for permit to only allow consumption and display of intoxicating liquor (set-up) from Richard W. Gunderson, Champlin Township, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Kenneth E. Pettijohn County Treasurer, designating depositories for County and Park Reserve District funds for two year term beginning April 1, 1969, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, submitting rightof-way documents necessary for the construction of CSAH 18 was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes. WHEREAS, It is necessary, advisable, and in the public interest for the safety of travel thereon to construct, reconstruct, improve, and maintain County State Aid Highway No. 18, and
