Tuesday, April 29, 1969

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Acting Chairman.

The minutes of the April 29, 1969, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce on Saturday, May 3, 1969.

The statement of balances in the County Revenue Fund (April 30, 1969) received from George B. Hickey, County Auditor, was ordered published and filed.

The monthly jail report from Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff, for April, 1969, was ordered filed.

The minutes of the meeting of the Metropolitan Council held on March 27 and April 10, 1969, were ordered filed.

Letters were received from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, as follows:

1. Submitting the Annual Report of the Personnel Board. Ordered filed.
2. Notifying the Board of Personnel board action changing salary range assignments for Chief Alcoholism Therapist and Hospital Controller.

Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Dr. V. K. Funk, Chest Clinic, submitting an application for admission to Glen Lake Sanatorium was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Purchasing Manager, as follows:

1. Requesting that funds be set aside for the payment of real estate taxes for the property at the new courts building site.
2. Submitting Building and Equipment Fund clearance.
3. Requesting travel authorization for various employees.

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Commissioner Robb moved, seconded by Commissioner Hanson that pursuant to recommendation from Richard Bardon, Jr., Purchasing Manager, the bid of Harris Machinery Company for the purchase and removal of X-ray film from General Hospital in the sum of \$2,841.82, Contract No. 9709, be approved and that the Chairman of the Board be authorized to execute the bill of sale on behalf of Hennepin County for the conveyance of said materials. Motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m. hearing was called for on the petition of the State of Minnesota for the right to make minor alterations in County Ditch No. 32.

The clerk to the Board presented the affidavits of publishing, mailing and posting the notices of hearing.

Larry Thompson, City Manager, Wayzata, spoke in apposition to granting the State the right to make the proposed changes because the city felt it would create a greater drainage problem in that area.

Representatives from the State and County Highway Departments were present.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the hearing be continued to May 20, 1969, at 10:30 a.m.
