The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m. pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the July 8, 1969, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, July 12, 1969.

Monthly Jail Report Work Release Program for June, 1969, was received from Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff, and ordered filed.

A resolution adopted by the Village Council of the Village of Independence, requesting the County to replace the bridge at Pioneer Creek with a concrete culvert was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A Notice of Hearing from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency in the Matter of the Applications of George Hedlund dba Dayton Trailor Park and Northwest Paper Company for variance from regulation WPC-1 to be held on August 11, 1969, at 10:00 a.m., State Board of Health Building, Minneapolis, was ordered filed.
