Tuesday, August 19, 1969

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the August 12, 1969, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, August 16, 1969.

The Minneapolis Aquatennial Association, represented by Todd Freeman and James Larson, presented the first place award to the Hennepin County Sheriff's Drum and Bugle Corps for its participation in the Aquatennial parade. The award was accepted by Captain John Richards of the Drum and Bugle Corps and Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff.

The proposed budget for the Hennepin County Park Reserve District for the year 1970 was presented and referred to the County Administrator.

A Council resolution adopted by the Village Council of Independence requesting authority to replace bridge over Pioneer Creek submitted by Philip R. Perkins, Attorney, was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

Personnel Board Action regarding establishment of new classifications and title changes, presented by John Hanson, Personnel Director, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A Notice of Claim on behalf of Julie Marie Schleif by Lynn G. Truesdell, Attorney, was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from John McDonald, President, District Council 3, AFSC & ME, requesting the Board to lift the staff "freeze" on certain County Welfare Department employees, was ordered held until hearings on the Welfare budget take place.

An order from the Minnesota Water Resources Board regarding the establishment of the Riley-Purgatory Creek Watershed District was ordered filed.

Section 10.9 - Paragraph 3 Any employee (1) found drinking alcoholic beverages during working hours, (2) intoxicated while at work or (3) consuming or being under the influence of a narcotic drug, (4) charged by formal complaint, information or indictment with a felony or (5) accused of a crime involving moral turpitude or (6) accused or other gross misconduct may be suspended without prior notice. misconduct shall include but not be limited to petty theft of public property, pilfering or the unauthorized taking of public property from a public building or premises for private use, insubordination which shall be the disobedience of a lawful order or failure to obey a lawful order given by a person authorized to give such orders. No employee suspended under the provisions of these rules for having been charged with a felony shall have a right to a hearing before this Board until the charge has been disposed of. Should subsequent investigation prove that the employee is not guilty of the charge, the employee concerned shall be reinstated to his former position with all rights and pay restored that would have accrued had he not been suspended.

Any permanent employee who is removed, discharged, or suspended without pay for more than 30 days in any 12 months or reduced in pay or position may appeal to the Board within 30 days after such action is taken. Upon such appeal, the appealing employee shall respond in writing to the appointing authority's written charges. The Board may consider any additional evidence produced by either party if relevant to the matters raised in the written charges or written response to the charges.

Section 15.4 - Paragraph 3
In all other hearings the burden of proof shall be upon the party requesting the hearing. At hearings, the reasons for discharge or suspension specified in the dismissal notice will be deemed to be the exclusive basis for the dismissal of suspension. If the Board finds that there is a basis

for disciplinary action, it may then consider any other pertinent material offered by either party for the purpose of reviewing or modifying the disciplinary action taken.
