Tuesday, September 30, 1969

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All members were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the September 23, 1969, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, September 27, 1969.

A letter from George B. Hickey, County Auditor, requesting consideration of applications from the Village of Plymouth and City of Crystal for conveyance of tax forfeited land was referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

Letters from V. K. Funk, M.D., Chest Clinic, requesting application for admission for 8 persons to Glen Lake Sanatorium were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A resolution adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County condemning the action of the Metropolitan Open Space Board was ordered filed.

Letters from Terry G. Nau, 4829 Boone Circle, Minneapolis, and Robert B. Alch, Equity Adjustment Company, submitting claims against the County for damages, were referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from Robert N. Stone, Attorney, regarding the claim of Leslie Stormoen, minor son of Gertrude Olson, Hennepin County Welfare recipient, requesting a hearing before the Board regarding the settlement of a claim as a result of injuries incurred by Leslie Stormoen in a water skiing accident, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

WHEREAS, the construction of Interstate Highway 94 through the Villages of Brooklyn Center, Brooklyn Park, and Maple Grove has severed the continuity of the Hennepin County-State Aid Highway System within said area, and

WHEREAS, revisions in said highway system are required to re-establish the continuity of County-State Aid Highway No. 130 and County-State Aid Highway No. 8, and

WHEREAS, meetings have been held with staff representatives from the affected municipalities to establish an acceptable revised County-State Aid Highway System, and

WHEREAS, it has been mutually agreed between these staff representatives and the Hennepin County Highway Division for certain changes in the County-State Aid Highway System.

THEREFORE, pursuant to a recommendation from Herbert O. Klossner, County Engineer, your committee recommends that the following actions be taken:

- (1) The County of Hennepin ^{COUNTY STATE AID HIGHWAY 130} ~~revoke the existing~~ designation of County

State Aid Highway No. 130 in accordance with the following description:

Commencing at a point on the north line of section 27, Township 119 North, Range 22 West, a distance of 586.8 feet west of the northeast corner thereof; thence, southeasterly along the centerline of the established public road through Sections 26 and 25, Township 119 North, Range 22 West, in the Village of Maple Grove to a point on the section line between the Village of Maple Grove and the Village of Brooklyn Park at or near the southeast corner of Section 25, Township 119 North, Range 22 West; thence, continuing easterly along the centerline of the established public road in the Village of Brooklyn Park through Section 31, Township 119 North, Range 21 West, and terminating at a point 210 feet east of the west line of the northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 119 North, Range 21 West, (on the centerline of 68th Avenue North) as described within the Commissioner of Highways Order No. 27368, dated April 15, 1958.

Also, commencing at the northeast corner of the northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of the northwest $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, Township 119 North, Range 21 West; thence, run southerly along the 1/16 line to the intersection of County-State Aid Highway No. 8 previously designated; thence, continue southerly on tangent for 188.75 feet; thence, deflect to the left on a $12^{\circ}00'$ Curve (delta angle $22^{\circ}-00'$) for 183.33 feet; thence, on tangent to said curve for 540.44 feet; thence, deflect to the left on a $5^{\circ}00'$ curve (delta angle $13^{\circ}25'38''$) for 268.6 feet; thence, on tangent to said curve for 25.5 feet; thence, deflect to the left on a $6^{\circ}00'$ curve (delta angle $28^{\circ}00'$) for 466.7 feet; thence, on tangent to said curve for 217.8 feet; thence, deflect to the right on a $6^{\circ}00'$ curve (delta angle $10^{\circ}00'$) for 166.7 feet; thence, on tangent to said curve for 400.0 feet; thence, deflect to the left on a curve having a radius of 229.2 feet (delta angle $34^{\circ}00'$) for 136.0 feet and terminating at a point located 210 feet east of the west line of the northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Township 119 North, Range 21 West, on the centerline of 68th Avenue North, as described within Commissioner of Highway Order No. 27368, dated April 15, 1958.
