Tuesday, October 28, 1969

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock, a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the October 21, 1969, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, October 25, 1969.

The Monthly Jail Report for September, 1969, from Donald J. Omodt, Sheriff, was ordered filed.

An order from the Minnesota Municipal Commission regarding annexation of property to the City of Hopkins, was ordered filed.

A memo from Richard G. Plufka, Chairman, New Hope Planning Commission, re: County Highway Program in the Village of New Hope, was ordered filed.

A letter from Thomas F. Mulrooney, M.D., Medical Director, Chest Clinic, submitting names of persons (2) for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A request from the Welfare Department submitting a list of names of persons eligible to receive transportation allowance was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Commissioner Robb, Chairman Committee on Roads and Lakes,

WHEREAS, The field survey and monumentation of the right of way of County State Aid Highway No. 24 in Section 21, Township 118, Range 23 has been completed, and

WHEREAS, A letter from Charles L. Horn, Jr., an attorney who is examining title to certain property in said section requesting the County of Hennepin to release their interest in County Road 24 as it was travelled in the year 1917; and

WHEREAS, County State Aid Highway No. 24 has since been reconstructed and the present road is approximately 100 feet Southerly of the old road; and

WHEREAS, The present owners of the property in question are also owners of the property abutting the present right of way of said Road 24 and have conveyed their interest to said Road 24 to the County of Hennepin without compensation.

THEREFORE; Pursuant to a request from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, your committee recommends that the County of Hennepin accept and record the Quit Claim Deed from Robert H. Bradley and Margaret M. Bradley for the land hereinafter described:

That part of the following described tract of land lying North of the centerline of County Road No. 24 and East of a line parallel with the East line of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 21, Township 118, Range 23 and 370 feet distant West therefrom as measured along the North line of said Northwest Quarter:

WHEREAS, Numerous man hours are spent in research and answering the questions of highway personnel, attorneys, abstractors, surveyors, utility companies, subdividers and other persons as to the exact location of our rights-of-way, and

WHEREAS, There are still several county roads the right-of-way of which has never been accurately surveyed and described, and

WHEREAS, Many of our roads have shifted and do not conform to the established right-of-way, and

WHERAS, The County of Hennepin has acquired an unrecorded easement by statutory right of user over many of these shifts in alignment, and

WHEREAS, The County Surveyor of Hennepin County has recently completed the remonumentation of all the government corners of suburban and rural Hennepin County, and

WHEREAS, One of the prime requisites of describing right-of-way is that it be referenced to one or more government corners, and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 160:14 as amended in 1969 authorize a right of way monumentation procedure and notice to the abutting property owners prior to establishing a permanent right of way record, and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 1967, Section 505:1792 as amended in 1969 authorizes and empowers Counties to file record plats of highways with the Register of Deeds and/or with the Registrar of Title showing the monumentation of the permanent right of way.

NOW THEREFORE, Pursuant to a request by A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, your Committee recommends that the Right of Way Section of the Hennepin County Highway Department with the co-operation and assistance of the Office of the Hennepin County Surveyor, survey, monument, describe and record in the Office of the Register of Deeds and/or in the Office of the Registrar of Titles a highway plat for all County Roads now designated and to be designated in the County of Hennepin.

WHEREAS, It is necessary, advisable, and in the public interest for the safety of travel thereon to construct, reconstruct, improve, and maintain County State Aid Highways No. 15 and 18.
WHEREAS, In order to accomplish these purposes it is necessary to acquire the fee title or easement to certain lands, and
WHEREAS, There is on file in the office of the Hennepin County Highway Department right of way maps detailing Parcels No. 1 through 66 for Construction Project No. 26610 and Parcels No. 28 through 43 for Construction Project No. 26802.
WHEREAS, the fee title or easements with respect to the parcels on the herein mentioned highways is necessary for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance, and safety of travel on said County State Aid Highways No. 15 and 18.
THEREFORE, Pursuant to a request from A. J. The matter of a proposal from Booz, Allen and Hamilton, Inc., for a contract for planning a new General Hospital was discussed.

- Employ Booz, Allen and Hamilton as consultant on a time and material basis as demanded by the Board.
- Interview other recognized, reputable hospital management consultants and specialists.
- 4. Architects, engineers interviewed said that they will do their own studies even if a consultant is hired.
- 5. Believe staff and local talent can do most of what Booz,
  Allen and Hamilton will do or hire some one to do it.

Commissioner Provo moved, seconded by Commissioner Olson that the resolution be adopted with TASKS 6 and 7 deleted as well as TASK 4.
