WHEREAS, Certain department heads have ongoing responsibilities that (1) frequently require immediate availability of automobile transportation on short notice (2) have travel requirements promoted by County business that are often not originated from or terminated at the normal work location and (3) experience frequent meetings and appointments outside normal working hours.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That effective January 1, 1970 the following department heads shall be eligible for car assignment or car allowance: Attorney, Assessor, Civil Defense Director, County Administrator, County Engineer, Director of Court Services, Director of Health & Hospitals, Library Director, Public Works Director, Superintendent of Park Reserve District and Sheriff.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said car assignment shall be in conformity with the attached policy and further that the Board resolution on January 16, 1968 be amended to provide for a Class IV allowance of \$100.00 per month.

Department Heads Car Assignment and Allowance Policy Recommendations

Department heads required to travel in the conduct of their daily activities may have the option of requesting either a) the full-time use of a County-owned car or b) a special car allowance for the unclassified service.

Car Assignment

A department head eligible for a car assignment shall meet the following criteria:

- 1) Frequently requires immediate availability of automobile transportation on short notice.
- Have travel requirements promoted by County business that are often not originated from or terminated at the normal work location.
- 3) Experience frequent meetings and appointments outside normal working hours.

The assignment of an auto will include a) provision by the County for upkeep (e.g. gas, oil, maintenance) and b) arrangement for a parking space at the normal work location.

The department head shall reimburse the County for an estimated amount of personal use. Reimbursement would be made on an individual basis by computing the distance from the user's home to office and multiplying this by the number of work days in a month and adding 50 miles per month to that total. Reimbursement to the County would be at the rate of \$.03 per mile.

Car Allowance

A department head eligible for but not assigned a County car is entitled to a monthly automobile allowance consistent with the demands placed upon the use of his personal car. The County shall reimburse monthly at a rate set by the County Administrator to a maximum of \$100.00. This rate class shall be added to the present department heads' mileage allowance schedule as Class IV. The allowance schedule shall then read as follows:

Class	I	\$25.00	Class III	\$ 50.00
Class	II	37.50	Class TV	100.00

All of the above provisions are subject to approval of the County Administrator and/or the County Board. Approval may be by individual, position classification or work assignment.
