The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the February 3, 1970, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, February 7, 1970.

The Report of Sheriff - Prisoners Confined in Hennepin County
Jail for January, 1970, was ordered filed.

A letter from Robert H. Rohlf, Director, Hennepin County Library, requesting the Board to secure an option to buy certain property, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from V. K. Funk, M.D., Chest Clinic, requesting approval for admission of a patient to Glen Lake Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A Notice of Hearing in the matter of the Standards of the State of Minnesota Governing Inter-state waters within the state, was received and ordered filed.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Director of Purchasing and Stores, as follows:

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

At 10:30 a.m., the County Board recessed until 11:00 a.m.

At 11:00 a.m. the Board reconvened for the purpose of opening bids for the purchase of bonds of the County.

The County Administrator reported that proper publication had been made in the official newspaper of Hennepin County and in the Commercial West of the notice of sale of \$3,060,000 Library Bonds and \$2,040,000 Hospital Bonds of the County as directed by the resolution adopted January 20, 1970, and that in accordance with the publications of the notice of sale a total number of eight sealed bids had been received at the office of the County Board at or prior to 11:00 o'clock a.m., Central Standard Time on this date, February 10, 1970. The Administrator presented the sealed bids so received, which were thereupon opened and publicly read, and the coupon rates and premium specified in each bid were tabulated, together with the dollar net interest cost and average annual net interest rate resulting therefrom. The tabulation of bids and the publishers' affidavits showing publication of the notice of sale were directed by the Chairman to be filed in the office of the Administrator.

Commissioner Provo then offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, in accordance with the resolution adopted January 20, 1970, notice has been duly published advertising for bids for the purchase of \$3,060,000 Library Bonds and \$2,040,000 Hospital Bonds of Hennepin County to be dated as of February 1, 1970, and all bids received in conformity with the notice have been duly and publicly opened, read and considered,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the bid offering the lowest net interest cost to the County is determined to be that of Morgan Guaranty Trust Company of New York, and associates, John Nuveen and Co., Inc., to purchase the bonds at a price of \$5,013,333, and bearing interest at coupon rates resulting in a net interest cost to the County of \$2,449,567, and an average net interest rate of 5.6703% per annum; that this bid is determined to be the most favorable and is accepted; that the Chairman of the Board and the County Administrator are authorized and directed to endorse the County's acceptance on the original bid and on a copy, and to deliver the copy to the successful bidder, and that the Administrator is directed to retain the check securing the successful bid until the delivery of the bonds and payment of the purchase price, and to return forthwith the checks securing the other bids received.

Your Committee recommends that all roads on the County and County State Aid System of Hennepin County not listed above, are restricted to 5 tons per axle weight; and

That the County Highway Engineer shall post the weight restrictions when he shall find that any such highway by reason of deterioration, rain, snow, or other climatic conditions will be seriously damaged or destroyed unless the weight restrictions shall be posted and enforced; and

That the County Highway Engineer shall have the authority to determine the limit of the weight restrictions with respect to any of the above designated roads when he shall find that any such designated highway will be seriously damaged or destroyed unless the use of vehicles thereon be prohibited or permissible weights thereof reduced; and

That in the interest of public safety, welfare and convenience, the weight limitations listed above shall not restrict the operation of public or school bus transportation, garbage trucks, emergency vehicles, such as fire, police of ambulance; and

That the County Highway Engineer shall have no authority to waive the weight restrictions with respect to any other vehicles.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE FORM AND TERMS OF \$2,040,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION HOSPITAL BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, as follows:

Section 1. Authorization and Sale of Bonds.

Pursuant to Minnesota Laws 1963, Chapter 738, Section 5 and Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475, and other applicable law, the electors of Hennepin County, by the required majority at the special election held September 9, 1969, authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds of the County in an amount not exceeding \$25,000,000 for the purpose of acquisition of facilities for Hennepin County General Hospital; and the Board has determined to issue bonds at this time pursuant to this authorization in the amount of \$2,000,000, and to include in said issue additional bonds in the amount of \$40,000 representing part of the interest cost thereof, as authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.56, which amount does not exceed 2% of the remaining amount of \$2,000,000 authorized and established as the minimum sale price of the bonds. The bonds so authorized have been duly advertised at public sale and sold in accordance with the most favorable bid received, for not less than the minimum sale price plus accrued interest to the date of delivery, and upon the further terms set forth in the notice and bid and in this resolution. They are designated as General Obligation Hospital Bonds, shall be dated as of February 1, 1970, and shall be issued, sold and secured as provided in this resolution and in conformity with Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475.

Section 2. Forms.

2.01 Bonds. The bonds shall be printed in substantially the following form, with appropriate insertions of serial numbers and interest rates:

This bond is one of a series in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,040,000, all of like date and tenor except as to serial number, maturity date and interest rate, all issued for the purpose of providing funds for acquisition of facilities for Hennepin County General Hospital, and is issued pursuant to authorization by the required majority of the electors voting thereon at a special County election duly called and held and pursuant to and in full conformity with the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota thereunto enabling, including Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475 and Laws 1963, Chapter 738.

The transfer of ownership of the principal amount hereof may be registered by the bearer on the books of the County at the Courthouse, Minneapolis, Minnesota, by presenting this bond for registration to the County Treasurer, who will note the date of registration and the name of the transferee in the registration blank on the reverse side hereof. Thereafter this bond may be transferred to a bona fide purchaser only by delivery with an assignment duly executed by the registered owner or his agent, and the County may treat the registered owner as the person exclusively entitled to exercise all the rights and powers of an owner until this bond is presented with such assignment for registration of transfer, accompanied by assurance of the

Section 3. Terms, Execution and Delivery.

3.01 Maturities, Numbers and Interest Rates. The \$2,040,000 General Obligation Hospital Bonds dated February 1, 1970, to be issued pursuant to this resolution shall be numbered and shall mature in order of serial numbers on February 1 in the years and amounts as follows, without option of prior payment, and shall bear interest at the annual rates stated opposite their maturity years and serial numbers, respectively, payable February 1, 1971, and semiannually thereafter on each August 1 and February 1:

- 3.02 Registration of Transfer. Transfer of ownership of the principal amount, only, of each bond may be registered on the books and records of the County in the office of the Treasurer, with the force and effect stated in the form of bond set forth in Section 2. The Treasurer shall maintain a register in which he shall enter, upon receipt of a request for registration of transfer, the date and the name and address of the transferee, corresponding to the endorsement of registration on the bond. Upon written advice of a change in the address of the registered owner, the Treasurer shall likewise enter the new address in the bond register. - 3.03 Paying Agent. Upon merger or consolidation of the paying agent, if the resulting corporation is a bank or trust company authorized by law to conduct such business, such corporation shall be authorized to act as successor paying agent. Upon the resignation of the paying agent, which shall be communicated in writing to the County not less than ninety days before it shall become effective, the County reserves the power to appoint a successor paying agent. No resignation and no appointment of a successor paying agent shall become effective until the date specified in a notice of the resignation and appointment which the County shall cause to be published in a financial newspaper in a Minnesota city of the first class or its metropolitan area, not less than thirty days before said effective date.
- 3.04 Execution and Delivery. The bonds shall be prepared for execution under the direction of the County Administrator, fiscal agent and attorneys, and shall then be executed in behalf of the County by the signature of the

Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, attested by the signature of the County Administrator, and sealed with the official seal; and the interest coupons shall be executed and authenticated by the signatures of said Chairman and Administrator. On the reverse side of each bond shall be printed a full, true and correct copy of the approving opinion to be rendered by bond counsel, followed by the certificate executed by the signatures of the Chairman and Administrator. The seal and all signatures appearing on the bonds and coupons shall be printed, lithographed or engraved facsimiles of the originals thereof, except that the Administrator shall manually sign each bond on its face. When the bonds have been so executed and authenticated, the County Treasurer shall deliver them or cause them to be delivered to the purchaser on receipt of the purchase price heretofore agreed upon, and the purchaser shall not be obligated to see to the application thereof.

3.05 <u>Disposition of Proceeds</u>. From the proceeds of the bonds the sum of \$2,000,000 shall be credited to a special construction fund or bookkeeping account on the official books and records of the County Treasurer and disbursed solely in payment of expenses, incurred and to be incurred, which in accordance with accepted accounting practice and the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.65 are capital costs reasonably necessary and incidental to the acquisition of facilities for the Hennepin County General Hospital. The remainder of the proceeds shall be credited to the sinking fund referred to in Section 4.

Section 4. Security.

- 4.01 <u>Pledge of credit</u>. The full faith and credit and unlimited taxing powers of Hennepin County are irrevocably pledged for the prompt and full payment of the principal of and interest on the \$2,040,000 General Obligation Hospital Bonds to be issued pursuant to this resolution, as such payments respectively become due.
- 4.02 Sinking Fund. RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE FORM AND TERMS OF \$3,060,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION LIBRARY BONDS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minnesota, as follows:

Section 1. Authorization and Sale of Bonds.

- 1.01 Authorization. Pursuant to Minnesota Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 24, Section 1, Subdivision 2, as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 967, Section 1, and Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 475, and other applicable law, and for the purposes stated in said Chapters 24 and 967, the Board has authorized the issuance of general obligation bonds of the County in the amount of \$3,000,000 for the purpose of acquisition, betterment and construction of county library buildings and branches thereof, and has determined to include in said issue additional bonds in the amount of \$60,000 representing part of the interest cost thereof, as authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.56, which amount does not exceed 2% of the remaining amount of \$3,000,000 authorized and established as the minimum sale price of the bonds.
- 1.02 <u>Statutory Conditions</u>. Under the provisions of said Chapter 967 the Board is authorized to issue these bonds by resolution adopted by a four-fifths vote, in the aggregate amount of \$20,000,000, provided that:
- (a) the total amount outstanding at any time may not exceed \$15,500,000; and
- (b) the bonds are not subject to the limitations of Minnesota Statutes, Sections 475.51 to 475.59, but the maturity years and amounts and interest rates of each series thereof are to be so fixed that the maximum amount of principal and interest to become due in any year on the bonds of that series and of all outstanding series issued for the purposes of libraries, will not exceed an amount equal to two mills times the assessed value of all taxable property in the County, which is not then taxed by any city or village for the support of any free public library, as last finally equalized before the issuance of the new series.
- 1.03 Determination of Compliance with Conditions. There are no bonds presently outstanding, issued under the provisions of Chapters 24 and 967. The assessed value of all taxable property in Hennepin County, outside the corporate limits of the Cities

of Minneapolis and Hopkins, as last finally equalized, according to the assessment made in 1969 for taxes collectible in 1970, is \$432,345,583, and two mills times this value is \$864,690. Section 3. Terms, Execution and Delivery.

3.01 Maturities, Numbers and Interest Rates. 3.02 Redemption Before Maturity. The bonds maturing in the years 1972 through 1982 shall not be subject to redemption before maturity. 4.04 Special County Library Tax. In accordance with the provisions of Extra Session Laws 1967, Chapter 24, Section 1, Subdivision 2, as amended by Laws 1969, Chapter 967, the County Board has levied a tax of two mills for collection in 1970, on taxable property within the County outside of any city or village in which is situated a free public library of the city or village, which property presently includes all taxable property outside the corporate limits of the Cities of Minneapolis and Hopkins. An Act relating to crimes and criminals; denying or interfering with the use of public property; providing a penalty.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota: Section 1.

624.72 Interference with use of public property

Subdivision 1. The state of Minnesota acknowledges and reaffirms the right of its citizens to petition, peacefully and in an orderly manner, all levels and units of government for the redress of grievances of whatever nature, but also affirms that functions and proceedings of governmental bodies and agencies must remain free from organized or calculated confusion, disturbance or delay, and that to this end rules and regulations for the governance of public property and business lawfully promulgated must be observed.

Subd. 2. As used in this section, "public property" means any building or other property owned by or in control of the state or any of its political subdivisions or of the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota.
