The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Applications for repurchase and conveyance of certain tax forfeited land from George B. Hickey, County Auditor, were referred to the Committee on Public Grounds and Buildings.

The Report on Examination of the Financial Affairs of Metropolitan Council for the year ending December 31, 1968, from Robert A. Whitaker, Public Examiner, was ordered filed.

A request to use camp site at Glen Lake for summer program from Richard J. Rothmund, Executive Director, Minneapolis Association for Retarded Children, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
