The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

The meeting was called to order by E. F. Robb, Jr., Vice-Chairman.

The Hennepin County Library Director's Report for June 25, 1970; Monthly Financial Statement for May, 1970; and the Library Board meeting of May 28, 1970, from Robert Rohlf, Library Director, were ordered filed.

An Application for Off Sale License to Sell non-intoxicating malt liquor, from E. G. Fiskewold, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A transportation allowance list from the Welfare Department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from V. K. Funk, M.D., Chest Clinic, submitting the name of one person to be admitted to Glen Lake State Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A resolution from Paul D. Rosso re: the City-County twin bridge agreement was ordered filed.

- 1. An overtime payment of fifty dollars will be made to the full-time Anesthesiologists when he remains on duty until 6:00 p.m. on those days when contract Anesthesiologists are utilized.
- 2. Additional overtime on-call payments will be made on the following basis:
  - a. Twenty-five dollars for being on-call or;
  - b. One hundred dollars if the Anesthesiologist is required to be on duty at the Hospital when on-call on weekdays (Monday-Friday).
  - c. Twenty-five dollars for being on call or two hundred dollars if required to be on duty at the Hospital on Saturdays, Sundays or major holidays.
- 3. In the circumstance when a second or third Anesthesiologist is called in to provide care by the person on-call, the Chief of Anesthesiology must authorize the reimbursement of these physicians at the same rate as a primary call physician.

Your Committee further recommends that this plan be approved on a short-term emergency basis or until such time as full-time Anesthesiologists are available for permanent staff positions at Hennepin County General Hospital.
