Tuesday, June 30, 1970

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

Commissioners Robb, Mrs. Scott, Olson and Hanson were present.

Commissioner Provo was absent.

The meeting was called to order by E. F. Robb, Jr., Vice-Chairman.

The minutes of the June 23, 1970, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, June 27, 1970.

The Hennepin County Library Director's Report for June 25, 1970; Monthly Financial Statement for May, 1970; and the Library Board meeting of May 28, 1970, from Robert Rohlf, Library Director, were ordered filed.

An Application for Off Sale License to Sell non-intoxicating malt liquor, from E. G. Fiskewold, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A transportation allowance list from the Welfare Department was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from V. K. Funk, M.D., Chest Clinic, submitting the name of one person to be admitted to Glen Lake State Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A resolution from Paul D. Rosso re: the City-County twin bridge agreement was ordered filed.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Director of Purchasing and Stores, as follows:

He said such action tends to jeopardize those positions which are presently in the classified service of Hennepin County. He requested the Board to lay over the award to Capitol Building Maintenance Corporation for janitorial

maintenance services at General Hospital in the sum of \$18,500.00.

A letter from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, submitting a proposed overtime compensation pay plan for Anesthesiologists at General Hospital was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John A. Hanson, Personnel Director, proposing that the rate for on-call nurses be changed from \$1.00 to \$1.65 per hour was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the July 14, 1970, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, July 18, 1970.

A report from Tony Hammel, re: Medicine Lake Pistol Range Report of Range Activity for June, 1970, was ordered filed.

A letter from George B. Hickey, County Auditor, submitting the 1971 budget request of the Municipal Building Commission was referred to the County Administrator and the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from John K. Harvey, County Attorney, submitting a request for an easement for water main purposes over certain property owned by Hennepin County in the City of St. Louis Park, was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter was received from Bruce Rasmussen, Secretary, Minnesota Municipal Commission, asking that the County Board appoint two County Commissioners to serve on the Minnetrista-Mound consolidation annexation hearing. A motion was made and seconded that Commissioners Provo and Robb be appointed to serve. Motion carried.

A letter was received from Ralph H. Martin, Village of Orono, requesting the Board to appoint two members to represent Hennepin County on the Lake Minnetonka Area Transportation Committee. A

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motion was made and seconded that Commissioner E. F. Robb, Jr., and A. J. Lee, Director, Public Works Department, or his representative, be appointed to serve as Hennepin County representatives. Motion carried.

A letter was received from Richard Bardon, Jr., Director of Purchasing and Stores, submitting specifications for Purchase and Removal of Buildings, Contract No. 0347, Public Works Department, with bids to be opened on Tuesday, August 11, 1970. A motion was made and seconded that the specifications be approved. Motion carried.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Director of Purchasing and Stores, as follows:

1. Submitting an agreement with the Minnesota Highway Department and the Village of Eden Prairie covering installation of a traffic control signal at the intersection of CSAH 4 and TH 5.
2. Submitting contracts and performance bonds.
3. Submitting Building and Equipment Fund claims.
4. Submitting travel authorization requests for various county employees.
5. Submitting supplemental agreement with the Roger Johnson Associates Architects in re: to Hennepin County Health Facilities-Center.
6. Submitting Fire Radio Service Agreement between the Sheriff's Office and the Village of Medicine Lake covering installation of two-way radio equipment in Village-owned fire vehicles.
