Tuesday, November 3, 1970

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., pursuant to law.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the October 27, 1970, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, October 31, 1970.

The Monthly Report for October, 1970, from Ben K. Allison, Register of Deeds, was ordered filed.

Twin Cities Area Metropolitan Transit Commission meeting minutes for August 19, August 26 and September 9, 1970, were ordered filed.

A letter from Bruce Rasmussen, Executive Secretary, Municipal Commission, in the matter of the consolidation of the Village of Minnetrista and the Village of Mound was ordered filed.

The License Fee Schedule for 1970 - Metropolitan Counties, from Joseph F. Ries, Scott County Auditor, was ordered filed.

A resolution adopted by the Scott County Board of Commissioners on October 27, 1970, requesting the Board to explore possibilities of joint county construction and funding of new bridge spanning the Minnesota River at CSAH No. 18 was referred to the Committee on Roads and Lakes.

A letter from Donald A. Todd, Executor of the estate of Marguerite Todd, presenting a claim in the amount of \$35,000, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from V. K. Funk, M.D., Chest Clinic, submitting the names of two persons for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter was received from Thomas R. Cook, Executive Secretary, Hennepin County Medical Society, requesting that the Board appoint one of its members to serve on the governing body of the Health Care Foundation. Pursuant to a recommendation from A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, your committee recommends that the following documents be accepted and recorded and that claims, if any, in the amounts stated be approved and ordered paid from the Road and Bridge appropriation.

Highway Easement from General Mills, Inc., a Delaware corporation, for land hereinafter described:

An easement for highway purposes, specifically to install a down guy wire, anchor and pole within a rectilinear plot described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest corner of Lot 3, Block 1, General Mills Crystal Addition; thence Easterly along the South Lot line for a distance of 17 feet; thence Northerly parallel to the West Lot line of the described Lot for a distance of 30 feet; thence Westerly parallel to the South Lot line to the Westerly Lot line; thence proceeding Southerly along the West Lot line to the point of beginning.

This easement shall cease and terminate five (5) years from the date hereof and at such time all property of the County of Hennepin located on said property shall be removed by said County and the premises restored to a condition compatible with Grantor's adjacent property.

Said County of Hennepin agrees to hold Grantor, its successors and assigns free from any liabilities and costs arising by reason of this easement and said County of Hennepin's use of the same.

Subject to all encumbrances, easements, restrictions and other matters of record, if any.

The above document is necessary for the construction of County Project No. 2097, CSAH No. 10.

A letter from V. K. Funk, submitting application (1) for admission to Glen Lake State Sanatorium, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

A letter from Schieffer, Hadley, Bakke and Jenson, Attorneys, submitting a claim in the amount of \$25,000 on behalf of Bonnie Humphrey, was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from Robert W. Rischmiller, Attorney, submitting a claim on behalf of Mrs. Vicki Villebrun, was referred to the County Attorney.

A letter from Donald Omodt, Sheriff, submitting a reimbursement check to the Sheriff's Department for the training of deputies, was ordered filed.

A letter from Captain John C. Richards, Hennepin County Sheriff's Drum and Bugle Corps, expressing appreciation to the Board for its support and encouragement throughout the year, was ordered filed.

A letter from Robert H. Rohlf, Library Director, requesting

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the Board to purchase site for Westonka Library, was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Letters were received from Stanley R. Cowle, County Administrator, and Richard Bardon, Jr., Director of Purchasing and Stores, as follows:

The above letters were referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

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Commissioner Provo introduced a resolution indicating the Board's intention to proceed with the construction of a new Civic Center, to issue general obligation bonds to assist in financing the project and to enter into a contract with Construction Management Services, Inc., to assume responsibilities of construction management, etc., for the project.

Commissioner Robb stated that he thought the timing for introducing the resolution was "strange" since it came one week after election. He said it was deficient in substance and didn't clearly define the problems facing the county.

Chairman Provo stated that the matter was not introduced in haste. It's a matter that has been before the Board for two and a half years. He said the resolution does not foreclose the possibility of a referendum but just commits the County to sell bonds for a building.

Earl Johnson, LTD Taxpayers Committee, objected to the introduction of the resolution, saying it was done in haste and in a "lame duck" session. He stated that he hoped the citizens of the community would be given an opportunity to vote on the matter.

Representative Ernest Lindstrom stated that it would probably be difficult for the County to obtain additional bonding authority for the building from the next session of the Legislature because of the present tax situation. He said he hoped that the resolution does not commit the County to go ahead with the project.

Others who spoke on the matter were representatives of Construction Management Services, Inc., Fred Watson, Board of Directors, Associated General Contractors and William Gary, Manager, Associated General Contractors.

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Commissioner Robb offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS THIS BOARD

1. Recognizes the critical need for additional "Court House" space for judicial and administrative assignments under law, said space requirements amounting to approximately 200,000 square feet immediately, 500,000 square feet within five to ten years, and 1,000,000 square feet (in total) within twenty to thirty years;
2. Recognizes current inflation and accelerating construction costs are eroding capital funds available to this jurisdiction for said purpose, said funds as of January 1, 1971, amounting to approximately \$8,800,000 in fixed assets at cost, \$16,000,000 in cash, \$6,000,000 in general obligation bonding authority, and \$8,000,000 (variable) in revenue bonding authority, a total of approximately \$38,800,000 plus whatever it may lawfully raise from current property tax levies in addition to supporting whatever bonds which may be outstanding from time to time.
3. Recognizes approximate current costs for presently proposed project amounting to \$8,322,842.60 in land and preliminary costs, \$59,559,600.00 in construction costs, \$13,148,220.68 for architect fees, furniture and moving expenses and jail and Court House remodeling, a total of \$81,030,663.28.
4. Insists upon construction, operational and functional efficiencies and economies in whatever buildings it undertakes to erect for said purpose;
5. Insists upon quality, proportion and design of said buildings being reflective of governmental stability and purpose and being aesthetically attractive and conducive to the development of surrounding properties and the community in which placed.
6. Hereby renews its determination to proceed carefully and responsibly in logical and sequential steps to construct needed space in the vicinity of the present Court House and elsewhere for jail, court and office purposes, consistent with the funds or monies available to it.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,

1. This Board directs the County Administrator to present to it a recommended contract for an independent estimate of the costs likely to be incurred by implementation of presently proposed architects' plans and specifications, said contract to be negotiated with Construction Management Services, Inc., or with a suitable alternative, and to contain provision for recommended options consistent with the aforestated monies available to this jurisdiction.
2. This Board will immediately consider alternatives to the "Twin Towers" design concept currently before it.
3. This Board directs the County Administrator to notify its present architect to discontinue immediately the Working Drawings on the project as presently constituted, until further notice formally authorized by this Board.
