Petty Cash ProceduresPurpose:

The purpose of the Petty Cash Fund is to provide a means by which nominal cash transactions, which require an immediate cash outlay, can be handled without undue delay and inconvenience. Although the amount of each transaction will be restricted by the balance of cash in the fund at any one time, generally each disbursement should not exceed \$5.00.

Responsibility:

The individual designated (the custodian) by the County Administrator has the sole responsibility for the Fund. The custodian insures that the authorized balance in the fund is always represented by cash, or cash pay-out slips (see attached) noting amount, date, reason for the disbursement, and the initials of the person receiving the cash. It must be remembered that this fund is designed for emergency use. It is not to be used to circumvent established purchase order procedures, and any such use will result in immediate revocation of the privilege.

Reimbursement of the Fund:

At least monthly but possible sooner depending on cash requirements, the custodian will prepare a "claim for payment," such claim to include a brief discription of all transactions during the period. Generally, office supplies expense (Account 201) should be charged when the fund is reimbursed. This claim for payment will be supported by the cash pay-out slips, and paid invoices or receipts when practical. Since the custodian has the responsibility for the Fund, reimbursement warrants should be made payable to him.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Inter-County Council adopted Resolution No. 71-3 dated January 20, 1971, requesting legislation which would finance county highway systems; and

WHEREAS, the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners endorses the MICC legislative policy on Financing County Highway Systems as outlined herein:

1. County State Aid Highway Funds: MICC recommends the enactment of legislation that would revise the present method of reporting and defining money needs for the purpose of allocating County State Aid Highway Funds. Specific legislative revisions should include: (1) Revision of the method of computing construction needs so that those needs represent actual construction costs, and 2) Repeal of the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1965, Section 162.07, Subd. 2, that provides that only construction costs of the center 24 feet in a city, village or borough with a population of 5,000 or more can be included in the reported money needs of a county.
2. Local Revenue Tax: MICC recognized that the heavy reliance on local property taxes for county highway financing purposes places an unfair burden on the property owner in the metropolitan area. MICC recommends that legislation be enacted by the State Legislature that authorized metropolitan counties to impose a local highway user or wheelage tax.
3. Highway User Tax Distribution: MICC supports the present method of allocating highway user tax revenue to counties and recognizes the need for an increase in highway user tax revenue that would enable the Commissioner of Highways to release Federal Aid Urban Funds to counties. Further, MICC continues to support the 29 percent allocation to Federal Aid Secondary funds to counties provided that: (1) the method of computing money needs be revised so that actual construction costs can be used by counties when establishing money needs, and (2) the present width restriction used in computing needs be eliminated.
4. Trunk Highway Turnback Program: MICC recommends that the following changes in the Trunk Highway Turnback Program be made: (1) Change the rules and regulations to extend the period of initial construction eligibility with turnback funds from five to ten years; (2) revise the rules and regulations to permit counties to be reimbursed out of future accruals to the county turnback fund for local money spent on trunk highway turnbacks in advance of regular funding and to grant counties with bonding authority for turnback purposes; (3) establish a construction priority system. (4) enact legislation that would increase funds available to the county turnback fund, and (5) enact legislation to impose a moratorium on trunk highway turnbacks when construction costs for existing turnback projects exceed available turnback funds.

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WHEREAS, the continued reliance of financing county highway systems on property tax revenues is unfair and not in the best interest of obtaining a balanced transportation system for the county and metropolitan area:
