When New Year's Day, Independence Day or Christmas Day fall on Saturday, the preceding day (Friday) shall be considered the official holiday for employees. An employee, regardless of his work schedule, shall receive the same number of holidays as an employee whose regular work week is Monday through Friday.
- The last work day immediately preceding Christmas (Christmas Eve) shall be observed and considered a day of leave with pay for all eligible employees subject to the following conditions. The employing officer in those offices which must remain open to the public for the performance of public business may designate a sufficient number of employees to maintain the continuity of County operations on such day. He shall thereafter grant compensatory time to those employees who were required to work on the day
