WHEREAS, General Mills, Inc. donated the additional right of way for the easterly half of the interchange at C.S.A.H. No. 18 and Betty Crocker Drive (formerly designated as Western Avenue) in the Village of Golden Valley; and

WHEREAS, Subsequently General Mills, Inc. donated to the Village of Golden Valley the necessary right of way to construct that part of said Betty Crocker Drive lying within their jurisdiction; and

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All Commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

At 10:00 a.m., Hearing was called for on the Board's intention to redistrict the County Commissioner districts.

The publishers affidavits of publishing the notice of hearing in Finance and Commerce and the Bloomington Sun were presented.

Chairman Provo asked for comments or proposals from the audience.

Marlo June, Village of Plymouth, expressed concern about the proposal to divide the Village of Plymouth into two districts. He said the Village would lose its identity under such a plan. He proposed that the village boundaries be followed placing the village in either the Fourth or Fifth District.

Pat Winsberger, Village of Golden Valley, said that those municipalities being placed in the Fourth District, previously in the Fifth District, will be denied a vote in County government for two additional years. Mary Traeger, Village of New Hope, said the proposed plan is a case of blatant gerrymandering.

John Sollie, 12th Ward, Minneapolis, spoke opposing the splitting of wards by district boundaries.

Chairman Provo said the proposed plan is in keeping with the Supreme Court's ruling on the one man-one vote principle; the district's are contiguous and that each combines suburbs with portions of the City of Minneapolis.
