Tuesday, November 2, 1971

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 a.m., pursuant to law.

Commissioners Provo, Robb and Lindgren were present.

Commissioners Olson and Hanson were absent.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the October 26, 1971, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, October 30, 1971.

A letter from Thomas L. Loberg, President, Minneapolis CLUC, submitting a resolution opposing reduction of financial support by the County of the Minneapolis Library, was ordered filed.

A letter from John McDonald, President, District Council 3, submitting a resolution re: funds to Minneapolis Public Library, was ordered filed.

The Report of Public Examiner on the Revenues, Expenditures and Debt of the Cities and Villages of Minnesota was ordered filed.

The September 30 meeting of the Library Board and Budget Summary for September 1971, from the Hennepin County Library were ordered filed.

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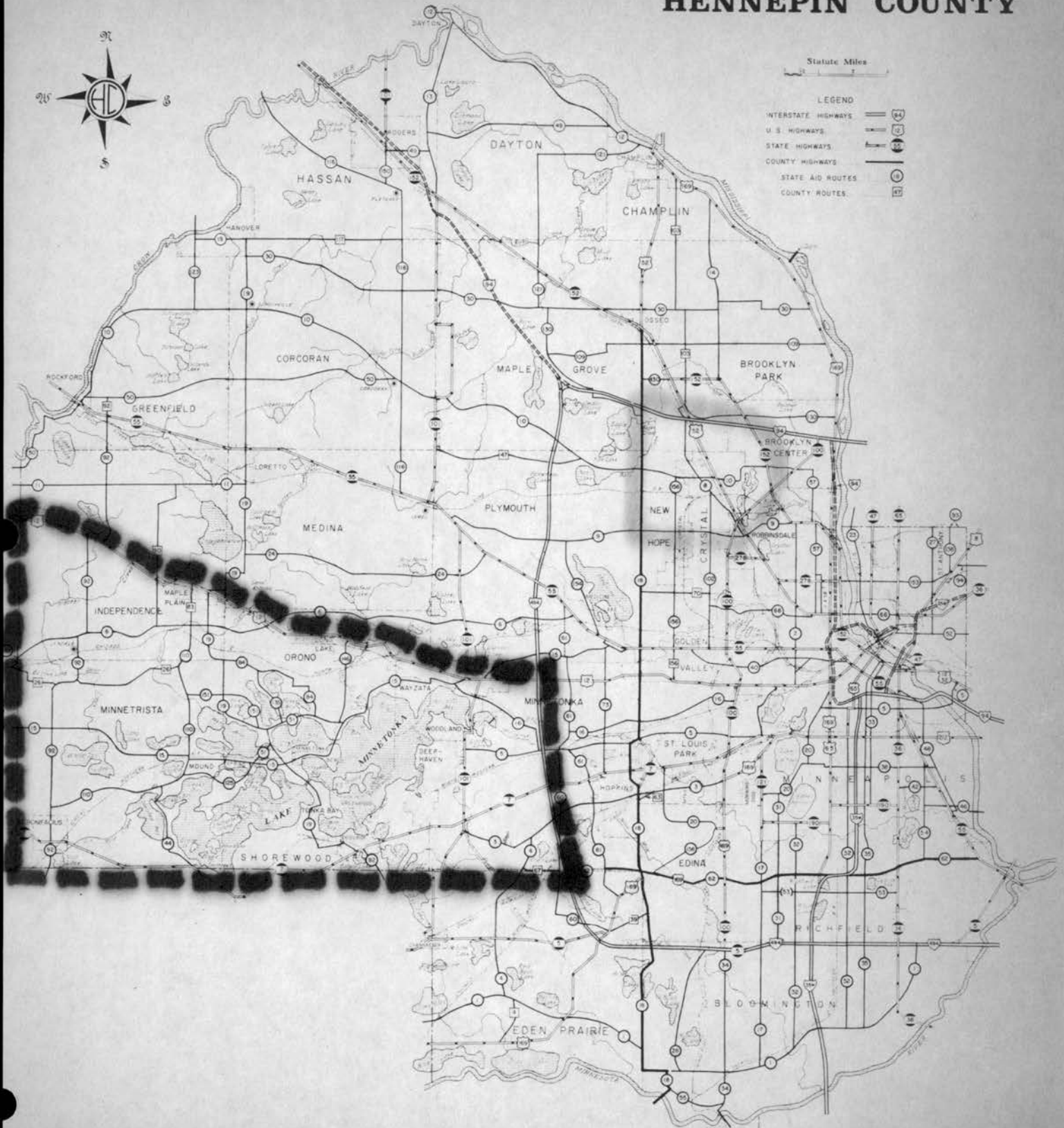



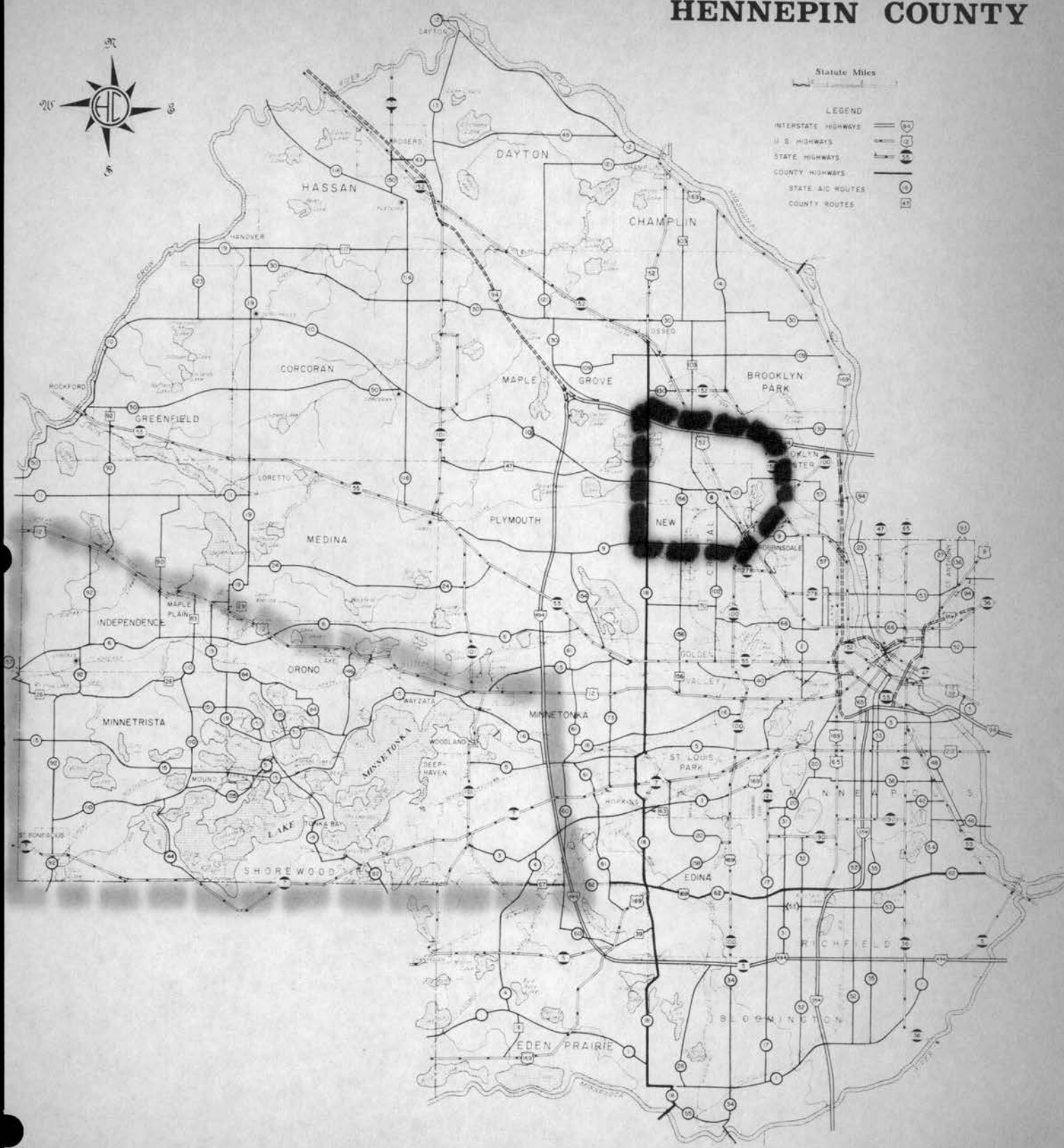
MAP OF HENNEPIN COUNTY





Off Duty Employment Policy

Hennepin County Sheriff's Department

Statement of Intent:

To provide full protection under the law to the County of Hennepin and employees of the Hennepin County Sheriff's Department. The Hennepin County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the following policy and fee schedule based on Chapter 692, Section 1, Minnesota Statutes, pertinent to providing of police services not normally provided in the ordinary cause of business.

Statement of Policy:

As of this date, the practice of Hennepin County Deputy Sheriff personnel contracting as private parties with business firms for the purpose of providing police related services of said business will henceforth cease. All off duty employment which requires the uniform and badge of the office of Sheriff will, as of this date, be contracted for between the County of Hennepin and the business firm involved.

The Hennepin County Sheriff's Department will be charged with the responsibility for the administrative detail connected with securing deputy sheriff personnel to fill any and all requests for contractual police service. A fee schedule commensurate with the top hourly rate of a senior deputy sheriff shall apply. In the event a request is received which requires five or more deputies for one event, it will be mandatory that an officer of the rank of sergeant or above be assigned to said detail to provide adequate supervision. Said supervisory personnel will be paid on a fee schedule commensurate with the top hourly rate of said supervisor. To the top hourly rate for a deputy sheriff and sheriff's sergeant shall be added direct salary costs incurred by the County. These costs include, but shall not be limited to, retirement (PERA) and workman's compensation insurance. A 10% administrative override will be attached to offset administrative costs of processing, supervision, and payrolling.

The departmental procedures to enact this policy and any subsequent amendments shall be reviewed and approved by the Personnel Department before enactment.

Off Duty Employment Policy
Hennepin County Sheriff's Department
Departmental Procedures

1. All police personnel now so engaged in off duty police related employment will be allowed to continue said employment upon completion of contract request form between the county and said business.
2. A list of deputy sheriff personnel wishing to work off duty in uniform will be secured and arranged by seniority in our department.
3. All new requests for off duty personnel for police related functions will be made in writing to the Sheriff's Department by the prospective employer.
4. The requests will then be filled from the list of men desiring said employment. All requests to be filled in order of seniority.
5. When a request is assigned to a deputy, the deputy will receive a copy of the request form (copy attached), which will be completed by the deputy and the employer as to the times, dates, and number of hours worked. Said form will then be returned to the accounting office for billing. It will be County policy that requests from business firms for police service will be accompanied by a check or money order to cover the said request. Emergency requests for police service may be billed to the business firm by the accounting office.
6. The Sheriff's Department will, upon receipt of the money, forward it to the Department of Finance where a check will be issued to the deputy on a monthly basis.
7. The request for contractual police service will be made with five copies. They will be dispersed as follows: Copies to Accounting Office, Service Division, deputy, private employer, and Patrol Division. Inasmuch as this is a new program, the distribution as to the number of copies may be minimized at a future date based on the need.
8. The copies of the request for contractual police service sent to the Sheriff's Patrol Division will be utilized for informational purposes for supervisory personnel on where and when Deputy Sheriff personnel will be working on police related employment. As such, supervision may be supplied as needed.
9. A ledger sheet will be made on all requests indicating date, employer, deputy, and hours worked and rate of pay. This would be used primarily for administrative purposes.
10. All rules and regulations of the Hennepin County Sheriff's Department and Hennepin County Personnel Department will apply to all off duty employment.

11. As requests for police service are submitted to our department, the request will be filled from the seniority list. Should a deputy turn down two requests in a row, regardless of reason for turn-down, said deputy shall be then placed at the bottom of the list.
12. On "long-term" job assignments, rotation of job assignment will be made every sixteen hours. This will allow all deputy personnel on the job list a fair chance to get job assignments.
13. It should be noted that at no time will deputy personnel be forced to accept a position. All requests for outside police related services will be filled on a volunteer basis.
14. Should the situation arise where the Sheriff's Department would not be able to furnish a deputy sheriff to fulfill a request by an outside firm, the firm shall be notified as soon as it is reasonably possible that the request will not be filled.

1537

Basic Functions:

1. To establish an environment for defining the short and long range information requirements for all functional areas of the County.
2. To provide an effective method for reviewing all requests for new informational systems and changes to any existing systems.
3. To establish priorities on all approved systems projects.
4. To develop an understanding between all functional areas of the County on the information requirements for each particular area.
5. To provide the basis whereby the Committee is the one body which can commit the County to a course of systems action.
6. To promote the effectiveness of the County Data Processing Department.

Specific Functions:

1. The EDP Advisory Committee will review all requests for systems change made by the specialized functional areas and any proposals initiated by the Data Processing Department to evaluate their worthiness and priority of implementation. Data Processing will prepare for presentation of the requests from each area to assist the Committee in obtaining an understanding of the request. Specifications on manpower requirements to accomplish and implement the request along with current backlog of work and available personnel will be interpolated for the Committee's consideration.
2. Data Processing equipment requirements will be reviewed and evaluated in light of the systems requests. Consideration will be given to alternative methods and economics involved both in machines and personnel.

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3. The schedule or priority of all systems work will be established and submitted to the Committee for approval. Any change in this schedule must also be approved.
4. The Committee will closely monitor the progress of all projects on a periodic basis. The results of these reviews will be documented.
