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Minneapolis, Minnesota Tuesday, May 23, 1972

The Board of County Commissioners for the County of Hennepin, Minnesota, met in the Court House in the City of Minneapolis, at 10:00 a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

All commissioners were present.

The meeting was called to order by Jack M. Provo, Chairman.

The minutes of the May 16, 1972, meeting were approved as published in Finance and Commerce, Saturday, May 20, 1972.

WHEREAS, It has become desirable to clearly define a program to insure that this philosophy is implemented in employment in the County and with agencies with which the County does business. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the attached policy and program be implemented. HENNEPIN COUNTY

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION POLICY

The Board of County Commissioners desires that every person be given full and equal opportunities for employment, training and promotion within the immediate Hennepin County family and within the broader community from whom Hennepin County purchases products and services. To that end, the Board of County Commissioners establishes this Affirmative Action Policy providing that no individual shall be discriminated against with respect to compensation, terms, conditions or other privileges of employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, physical condition or age.

Communication of Policy

Communicate County Affirmative Action Program policy to all County employees.

Initially the County's AAP policy will be printed and distributed to each employee. After the initial notification, copies of the policy will be made available to all new employees until such time it can be printed in the County Employee Manual.

Conduct orientation on County AAP policy for management staff.

Several programs will be established to explain the purpose of the County's AAP plan to clarify the County Board's position on this policy and to answer any questions that management staff may have regarding the policy's intent. Subsequent programs will be conducted annually or as necessary to communicate and clarify modifications in the program based on changes in policy or changes in Federal or State legislation and regulations.

Conduct orientation on County Affirmative Action Program policy for key personnel.

The same approach will be used here as with County management staff; however, key personnel who are involved in communicating either to County employees or to the public will be included in this orientation session.

Post County AAP policy on departmental bulletin boards.

This policy will be posted on all departmental bulletin boards in every County agency or location.

Utilize appropriate equal opportunity posters on County bulletin boards.

Any appropriate posters or other publication put out emphasizing the importance of equal employment opportunities will be posted throughout the County on bulletin boards. These will be maintained by a designated department representative who will be responsible for insuring that they are current and that appropriate new posters are posted as they become available.

Include County AAP policy in Administrative Manual.

This Manual is available to all administrators on County administrative policies and the AAP policy will be included.

Communicate to unions representing County employees the County's AAP policy.

Orientation programs will be held with appropriate union leadership to clarify the County's AAP plan in the same manner as it is clarified with management staff. It will further be emphasized in these sessions that it is the County's intent to fully comply with the policy and to develop programs in cooperation with various unions to insure a maximum participation on their part in making the AAP program effective.

Make County's AAP policy available to job applicants.

This policy shall be posted on the bulletin boards in the Personnel Office and any other recruiting source that the County may use. Copies will be available and placed in a prominent location for review by job applicants.

Communicate to recruiting sources the County's AAP policy.

Recruiting sources will not only be sent a copy of the County's AAP but will be informed of the County's strong intent to comply. Large recruiting sources will receive special contacts by personal visit to insure their understanding and compliance with this policy.

Include County's AAP policy in Employee Manual.

The summary of the County's policy will be placed in the Employee Manual so that the employees are readily aware of the County's policy on this matter.

Designate full-time person to direct County's AAP.

In order to insure full compliance with this program and to carry out an effective educational program, the office of County Administrator shall designate a full-time person whose major responsibility will be to implement the Affirmative Action Program. This person shall report to the Hennepin County Personnel Board and the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners within 90 days delineating staff requirements, scope of program and other considerations relative to this policy statement.

Identify areas in County programs where AAP is most needed.

Evaluation will be made of employee attitudes and locations where there are few minorities, women and physically impaired persons.

Periodically review changes in Federal and State legislation to assure AAP compliance.

This will be a responsibility of the Director of the County's AAP and will require continual review of any changes in legislation that would impact the County's AAP.

Develop AAP policy guidelines for vendors and contractors who deal with Hennepin County.

In order to effectively clarify the County's position, guidelines must be established to insure that vendors and contractors conform to equal opportunity practices in the employment of minorities, women, physically impaired persons and older workers.

Expand studies of minorities, women, physically impaired and older workers in each County department.

Currently studies are conducted on a periodic but not scheduled basis. Studies will be conducted on a regular basis and appropriate data to conduct these studies will be built into computer programs to improve the current nature and accuracy of this data.

Conduct studies in evaluating effectiveness of County AAP.

Such studies should be conducted on a periodic basis. This data should be available to a limited number of persons in personnel or administration to insure the protection of the identity of those individuals included in the studies. The purpose of the studies will be to evaluate the quality of the County's AAP and to recommend alternative solutions to improve and up-grade the calibre of the program.

Develop AAP policy guidelines for each department.

Each department has unique problems and unique situations. Secondly, distribution of minorities, women and physically impaired may vary between departments and so it is necessary that studies be done and guidelines be established to improve the effectiveness of AAP in each County department.

Expand counseling to supervisors and employees to resolve complaints affecting minorities, women, physically impaired and older workers.

Where complaints have been identified which affect minorities, women, physically impaired or older workers, special counseling will be given by the AAP Director or appropriate administrator to assist them in evaluating their perspective and improving the quality of understanding in dealing with these groups.

Prepare an annual report on County AAP effectiveness.

This report will include not only statistics but also changes that are taking place as a result of the County's AAP. It will identify strengths and weaknesses and will be made available to the Board or other appropriate units of County Government.

Expand County effort to explain non-discrimination.

This will be a program under the direction of the AAP Director and will include programs conducted both for employees through orientation or other types of sessions that may be considered appropriate as well as making the County AAP Director available to discuss the County's program in the area of non-discrimination among the minorities, women and physically handicapped to the public.

Recruitment

Advertising in minority newspapers.

Currently job postings are made in minority newspapers but evaluations would be continually made on all minority newspapers to determine how we can expand the contacts by use of minority newspapers in advertising County job vacancies.

Send job postings to all agencies representing minorities or to those that request them.

Periodically all agencies representing minorities will be contacted to determine their interest in receiving all job postings for County positions. Those who are interested will routinely be sent copies of all open-competitive job postings.

Encourage minorities, women, physically impaired persons and older workers to refer other minorities, women, physically impaired and older workers to County vacancies.

Often times it is appropriate to use these individuals in recruiting other individuals and making them aware of County positions. A planned program will be arranged to insure that their utilization in contacting others is maximized.

Expand notification of vacancies to predominately minority and women colleges throughout the country where applicable.

Currently this is done with certain colleges, however, lists will be established of schools that have predominately minority and women students and they will be notified of all job vacancies that would be appropriate to their graduates.

Expand publication of employment opportunities in minority press and minority organizations.

Currently advertising is done in minority press, however, it would be desirable to also develop press releases identifying more background on County positions that may be of interest to minorities. The Director will evaluate the appropriate kinds of positions where special efforts should be made in recruiting minorities or may be of interest to minorities and insure press releases will be made available on such positions.

Include equal opportunity slogans in recruitment advertising.

This slogan will be put on all recruitment advertising.

Expand use of staff members in recruiting in schools with high proportions of minority students.

While staff members are sent out to schools, there would be a particular emphasis placed on contacting schools where the proportion of minorities is somewhat higher than other high schools and colleges in this area.

Expand personal contacts with members of the minority community.

In order to insure that there is a maximum contact with minority communities, contacts will be made through minority individuals as well as social or professional organizations representing minorities.

Expand special recruitment programs directed to minorities, women, physically impaired persons and older workers in classes where representation is currently limited.

In evaluating the County's minority, female, physically impaired or older worker representation, particular emphasis will be noted where the number of such individuals are limited or non-existent. The Director will be responsible for identifying these areas and bringing it to the attention of the recruiters so that additional programs or maximum efforts will be made to recruit such individuals in those areas where the numbers are limited.

Selection

Validate screening process.

This is a continuing process, however, emphasis should be made to strengthen the program by making more staff time available and to have a scheduled plan of review of screening processes so that they reflect changes in functions of positions. Particular emphasis should be made in the selection process in obtaining minority, women, physically impaired persons and older workers.

Conduct programs of evaluating qualifications to maximize job opportunities available to all applicants.

The Personnel Department is responsible for setting up a scheduled program to regularly evaluate the appropriateness of the qualifications for each job classification. Particular notice will be taken of the ability to select minorities, women and physically impaired persons in considering these qualifications.

Encourage departments to give consideration to minorities, women, physically impaired and older worker candidates.

Since departments have the opportunity to select from any one of three candidates in any particular position, the Personnel Department will make a special point of encouraging them to hire qualified applicants from one of these four groups of people. This will occur both at the time of certification and in special meetings scheduled both with department heads and appropriate divisions within the departments who are involved in the selection process.

Expand development of career ladders for persons with limited education and experience.

Currently there are career ladders; however, an evaluation should be made of all areas in the County where such individuals can be brought in and then given an opportunity to progress to higher level positions within the County. Every effort should be made to insure that no one is employed in a position at an entry level where progress is precluded.

Expand use of minority and women on oral examination boards.

Currently minorities are used on oral examination boards; however, special notation will be made to all personnel representatives who are involved in the selection of oral examination boards to remind them to insure a maximum utilization of minorities and women on such boards.

Expand counseling program to minority, women, physically impaired or older worker applicants who are interested in an explanation of the County selection process.

Minority, women, physically impaired and older worker applicants will be informed that counseling on the selection process is available to them and time will be made available to those who are interested in having the County's selection process explained so that there is a better understanding and less apprehension about such process.

Analyze movement of minorities, women, physically handicapped persons and older workers through the selection process to locate potential sources of discrimination.

Data will be made available only to the personnel staff identifying minorities, women, physically impaired persons and older workers. The purpose of this will be to study any point in the selection process that may inadvertently discriminate against such individuals, where said discrimination cannot be supported by job requirements. As much as possible this information will be computerized and used with statistical data so that individual persons are not identified.

Affirmative Action Program Page 7 Selection (Con't).

Maintain special data on the reasons why minority, physically impaired, women or older worker applicants have been refused.

Again, this data will be restricted to the County Personnel Office. Records will be maintained to identify the reasons why such individuals have been refused appointment either as a result of the examination process or as a result of selection. A study will be made of these reasons to determine whether discrimination is a factor in any particular area of the County or in any particular process.

Training

Make available training to present minority, women or physically impaired employees in applying for promotional examinations.

Such training will be made available in several different manners. It may be on-the-job training by management; it may be tuition reimbursement or other skills training that will offer the minority, woman or physically impaired employee an opportunity to upgrade skills to the level of the higher positions for which he is interested.

Expand courses in skills development for employees with limited education and experience.

Currently a number of skills courses are available through on-the-job training, departmental training programs or tuition reimbursement. The County will expand the skills training available through these methods so that any individual may take advantage of improving his skills to better perform in the position in which he now serves or other positions in which he may be interested.

Expand minority awareness program.

Training programs will be developed beyond those now currently conducted by the County. The result will be that specially conducted programs will be conducted on a regular basis making County employees aware of different cultural or ethnic backgrounds and improve an understanding and the quality of working relations that exists among a variety of County employees.

Expand orientation programs for all employees with emphasis on effective relationships with minority, women, physically impaired or older employees.

The County will make a particular emphasis on its commitment to the AAP and non-discriminating relationships both with management personnel and peer level personnel. Orientation will include an awareness of minority situations as well as situations in which women, physically impaired and older employees find themselves unable to develop understanding on the part of other employees and improve their working relationships.

Promote educational programs leading to a high school equivalency certificate.

The County will convey to all employees, particularly minorities, women and physically impaired the desirability and availability of high school equivalency certificates. Efforts will be made to maximize the convenience of getting such certificates for the certificate.

Expand recruitment for interns or work-education programs for minorities, women or physically impaired persons.

Particular emphasis will be placed on contacting minorities, women and physically impaired persons toward work-education programs and internships. The Personnel Department as well as department management will strongly encourage such individuals to apply for positions and make them available to such individuals whenever possible.

Contracts

Develop guidelines for contractors and sub-contractors regarding County AAP or non-discrimination clauses.

The County will make available its AAP to all contractors, vendors and sub-contractors. Further it will make it clear to such contractors about its commitment to such a program. It will further develop guidelines of what it expects of contractors in developing their own AAP or non-discrimination clauses. In all contracts, such guidelines will be included.

Include an equal opportunity employment clause on all proposals.

On all proposals sent out, a clause identifying the County's intent for compliance with the AAP will be included. Space will be provided for the vendor to signify his intent to comply with an anti-discrimination clause on each proposal response.

Require all contractors on County Building construction to develop AAP's in accordance with County guidelines.

Particular emphasis will be placed on all construction projects requiring compliance. This will be dealt with on a unique basis because of the intermittent and somewhat unique conditions under which these projects occur. Work will be done with unions that represent employees on such projects and the contractors to insure that they have an effective AAP and that such program is conforming to the County guidelines

Develop an annual report identifying the minority firms with which the County does business.

This will be developed by the Purchasing Department in conjunction with the Department of Administration. It will identify all firms and the types of work or contracts that they have had with the County in the previous calendar year.

Expand and maintain a list of local and national minority firms with goods and services that could be used by the County.

This will be the responsibility of the Purchasing Department. It will continually seek out lists of such firms and make them aware of the opportunity to bid for County goods and services.

Monitor effectiveness of Affirmative Action Program with contractors and vendors.

Evaluate on a regular basis compliance with the AAP's by appropriate sampling and present periodic reports to the County Administrator and County Board. If problems occur, the Board will determine appropriate action to be taken in dealing with contractors that may not be complying.

Develop quarterly reports indicating the number and type of employees who are minority, women, physically impaired or older workers.

This report will be the responsibility of the AAP Director. It will be broken down by unit, department as well as an overall report for the County. It should draw comparisons with previous quarters and previous years to indicate progress in the employment of such individuals.

Report results of County AAP to County Board, Administrator and department heads on a quarterly basis and evaluate the program's effectiveness.

This report will be completed by the County AAP Director and will include statistical data by department. It will also deal with recommended programs that will improve the effectiveness of the County's Affirmative Action Program.

Commissioner Lindgren offered the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, That there is hereby created a Committee on Detention Facilities to be charged with the following responsibilities:

- 1. The Committee shall be responsible for reporting to the Ways and Means Committee of the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners its recommendations for the program components, size, location and costs for a new Hennepin County Jail, Workhouse or other detention facilities to be operated, controlled or administered by the County of Hennepin at the present time or in the future.
- 2. The Committee shall consider in its study the SUA report entitled "A Study for Hennepin County, Minnesota: Program and Facility Requirements for Adult and Juvenile Corrections"; reports submitted by various Grand Juries; previous County staff reports; reports and correspondence of the Sheriff; the "Guidelines for the Planning and Design of Regional and Community Correctional Centers for Adults"; and any other literature the Committee may deem appropriate.
- 3. The Committee shall also be authorized to make selected site visits to jails which the Committee deems appropriate to the study.
- 4. The Committee shall seek advice and counsel from the Minnesota Jail Consultant. If the Committee deems appropriate, it may also solicit advice and counsel from the Federal Bureau of Prisons, the National Clearinghouse for Correctional Programming and Architecture, the American Correctional Association and the National Sheriffs Association, and other appropriate agencies.
- 5. The Committee shall submit its report to the Ways and Means Committee not later than August 1, 1972.

WHEREAS, Abandoned autos and junk autos are a detriment to the environment and constitute a hazard to the health and welfare of the people of Hennepin County, and are a waste of a valuable source of useful metal; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes 1971, Chapter 168-B, enables Hennepin County to carry out an abandoned auto cleanup program; and

WHEREAS, State funds are available to reimburse Hennepin County for costs incurred in an abandoned auto cleanup program; and

WHEREAS, Hennepin County is an appropriate unit of government to carry out such a program because of the county's responsibility for an overall solid waste management plan for the County of which junk autos and abandoned autos are a part.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That:

- 1. A. J. Lee, Director of Public Works, is authorized to apply to the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency for grants for the implementation of a County abandoned motor vehicle program, and for establishment of permanent and regional collection sites.
- Luther D. Nelson, Chief, Environmental Program Services Section, is designated Solid Waste Officer for administrative purposes as required in the Pollution Control Agency abandoned auto regulations.
- 3. The Public Works Department is authorized to conduct an abandoned auto cleanup campaign in cooperation with the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and Hennepin County municipalities.
- 4. The Public Works Department is authorized, in cooperation with the County municipalities and other interested parties, to obtain releases from owners of abandoned autos which assigns the vehicles to Hennepin County.
- 5. The Public Works Department is directed to prepare for County Board approval, as necessary, contracts for the collection, storage and transporting of abandoned autos from their present locations to scrap metal processors.
- 6. The Public Works Department is directed to provide if necessary an ongoing system for recycling abandoned autos in accordance with state laws, Pollution Control Agency rules and regulations, and the Pollution Control Agency cost reimbursement program.

"Guideline #5: Physicians and hospitals should work toward the development of out-of-hospital community health services to improve convenient access to care. Guideline #5s: Proposals for future development shall be submitted for the development of primary care services located convenient to the people in their communities and neighborhoods."

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board advise the Minnesota State Board of Health on its action in reference to the adoption of its Affirmative Action Program and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners commit themselves to the continued development of primary care programs on a decentralized basis in conjunction with and cooperation with the Hennepin County community including other providers of health care, consistant with guidelines established in the Metropolitan Development Guide and,

- 3. That each metropolitan county which is contractually delegated administrative powers from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency will, in accordance with the permissive authority granted in Minnesota Statutes, Section 116.05 and 471.59 enter into joint powers agreement to establish a Metropolitan Air Pollution Control Commission which will enforce the provisions of air pollution control ordinances adopted by each of the seven metropolitan counties.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Inter-County Council has approved the concept of the said proposal and has urged each of its member counties to do the same,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners supports and endorses the terms and conditions of the said air pollution control proposal and directs the County Administrator to technically review the provisions of the proposal and to make recommendations for adoption to the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners.

WHEREAS, The County of Hennepin is in the process of constructing a new Hennepin County General Hospital pursuant to the provisions of the laws of Minnesota 1963, Chapter 738, Section 3, Subdivision 5, and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the provision of said chapter, particularly Section 1, subdivision 2, this Board has authority to contract with hospitals for the purpose of attaining the highest degree of economy and effectiveness in the administration and financing of hospital care and medical service, and

WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Medical Center which operates a hospital complex which will be adjacent to the new Hennepin County General HOspital through its governing body and the Hennepin County General Hospital staff personnel and administrative staff of Hennepin County, together with other interested public bodies, have signified that the joint operation of hospital facilities by the above two hospitals would offer immediate and long range advantages toward affecting a high degree of economy and effectiveness in the administration and financing of hospital and medical care, and

WHEREAS, It is proposed that hospital facilities be erected to be used by both Metropolitan Medical Center and the County of Hennepin including a facility to provide a common access between the proposed Metropolitan Medical Center and the Hennepin County General Hospital over and above Chicago Avenue in theCity of Minneapolis, and

WHEREAS, It is proposed that the Metropolitan Hospital, a proposed Minnesota non-profit corporation, whose Articles of Incorporation and by-laws have been submitted to this Board would acquire land by purchase and donation as a site for such hospital facility and would construct and equip a hospital facility thereon and would lease the same to Hennepin County and the Metropolitan Medical Center, and

WHEREAS, The County of Hennepin has provided for architectural services in the design and plans of the new Hennepin County General Hospital facility which plans and specifications have been reviewed by this Board and should be and are hereby mede available to Metropolitan Hospital as an aid to and be used with the construction plans to be used by Metropolitan Hospital in the acquisition, construction and equipping of the hospital facility to be used jointly by Metropolitan Medical Center and the County of Hennepin, and

WHEREAS, It is proposed that Metropolitan Hospital shall (1) issue its First Mortgage Hospital Revenue Bonds in an amount sufficient to finance such acquisition and construction, (ii) lease the hospital facility to Hennepin County and Metropolitan Medical Center, the lease to Hennepin County would be for a term of five years renewable at the option of the County during the term of the

Financing Agreement in the form of the lease attached hereto, and (iii) convey its entire interest in the Hospital Facility to Hennepin County, Minnesota by Quit Claim Deed and Bill of Sale, which are to be placed in escrow for delivery to Hennepin County, Minnesota when all of the First Mortgage Hospital Bonds of the Corporation have been fully paid, and

WHEREAS, This Board on January 4, 1972, passed a resolution supporting the concept of a non-profit corporation to insure continued plan development of the proposed shared hospital facility with the Metropolitan Medical Center and authorized its administration to explore further the legal and fiscal implications of the construction and financing of the facility by such corporation,
